

PUMPKIN PATCH 2021 PROCEDURES

If you are volunteering for the first shift of the day, or there is no one working the patch when you arrive for your shift, you should follow these procedures:

Be sure to check Honor Jar for any overnight contributions. The cash box and the Samsung tablet are in the Office. The first time you work in the patch, co-leaders will show up to show you how to work the tablet, and there are instructions in the bottom of the cash box.

There are two sources of keys to the building if you do not have one: hanging on a hook in the trash bin on the right inside door are keys to the building and when you have the cash box, there is a building key labeled BATHROOM.

Once you have opened the patch, if you leave for any reason (restroom or your shift ends and next work is not there), please make sure the cash box and table are locked in the kitchen (bottom fat drawer next to the refrigerator). Then call Maryann or Jane so they can pick them up and lock in the office.

Many shifts are filled, but some have only one person. Invite one of your friends to come by for a 2.5-hour conversation while you are serving. Many slots are filled, but it may be that some will not be. Leave the Honor Jar instructions so people coming to buy can purchase via cpfumc.org/donations on their phones or leave cash in the Honor Jar.
