Live Stream Worship Now on Website Home Page

Since March 2020, we have been livestreaming a Sunday morning worship service. Originally, the livestreaming destination was Facebook-only since that was the most convenient destination technologically, members knew how to use it and there was no cost involved beyond the livestreaming system in which we had already invested.

In the Spring of 2021, we expanded our livestreaming destinations to include our YouTube channel. This allowed us to expand our livestreaming reach to those who were unfamiliar with Facebook or did not have a Facebook account. It also gave us an additional outlet in case there were problems with the Facebook-only connection. To make this expansion, we established an account with Restream.io, a local multi-streaming company headquartered in Austin. This costs us about \$33 a month.

Restream has now developed a new technology to embed our livestream on our own church website at no additional cost to us. The only technological limitation is that the website- embedded livestream does not currently have the chat functionality available at our Facebook and YouTube destinations. HOLY LAND TRIP

Saturday, May 28 Itinerary: Board your flight and begin your adventure.

Sunday, May 29 Itinerary: Arrive in the Holy Land and transfer to your Netanya hotel. Hotel: Leonardo Plaza

Monday, May 30 Itinerary: Journey to Caesarea by the Sea. Most experts believe Paul addressed King Agrippa and Festus here. Explore many extensive remains, including a Roman aqueduct, Herod's Palace, and Crusader Ruins. You'll also have the possibility of free time at the seaside. Mt. Carmel is where Elijah called down fire from heaven. From atop you can view the whole Jezreel Valley. In Nazareth, imagine Jesus's childhood and when his fellow villagers tried to throw Him from a cliff. Megiddo holds fascinating ruins, most especially a tunnel dug thousands of years ago to bring water to the city. After your day's adventures, transfer to your Galilee hotel for dinner and overnight. (B, D) Hotel: Leonardo Club

Tuesday, May 31 Itinerary: From the top of Mt. Arbel, you can see all the way from the Golan Heights to the Jordan Valley. After you come down, you'll pass through the Valley of the Doves, a beautiful portion of the path Jesus and His followers would take when traveling between Nazareth and Capernaum. As you explore Magdala, you'll learn how Jesus shocked religious leaders by letting women experience worship in unheard of ways. Overlooking the Sea of Galilee is the peaceful Mount of Beatitudes, where Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount. And Eremos Cave is where Jesus would enjoy solitude. The Church of the Fish and Loaves celebrates when Jesus fed the multitude with just a few fish and loaves. Jesus spent much of His ministry in Capernaum and called several of the disciples. Then enjoy a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee before traveling back to your Galilee hotel for dinner and overnight. (B, D) Hotel: Leonardo Club

Wednesday, June 1 Itinerary: Travel to Beit Shean, which has been continuously inhabited for over 5,000 years and is where the Philistines hung the bodies of Saul and his sons on the city walls. Jesus began preaching and proclaiming the Kingdom of Heaven after His baptism by John. If you want to affirm or declare your faith today, wade into the same waters He did for your own baptism. Walk the remains of an ancient community near the shores of the Dead Sea at Qumran. In the caves near here, Bedouins discovered what became known as the Dead Sea Scrolls. Then enjoy the drive to your Dead Sea hotel for dinner and overnight. (B, D) Hotel: Leonardo Plaza Dead Sea

Thursday, June 2 Itinerary: Encounter Masada, the spectacular mountaintop fortress built by Herod that later became the final tragic stronghold of the Jewish rebellion against the Romans. Ride the cable car or hike to the top to explore the fortress and look down upon the remains of

the Roman camps and siege ramp below. Jericho is another city that has been continuously inhabited for thousands of years. Here you can tour the ruins of the ancient city Joshua conquered. Off in the distance, you can see the traditional site of the Temptation of Jesus. View the Wadi Qelt, a deep gorge in the Judean Wilderness that may be the "valley of the shadow of death," referred to in Psalm 23. Then enjoy an amazing view of Jerusalem from Mount Scopus. Transfer to your Jerusalem hotel for your overnight stay. (B) Hotel: Olive Tree

Friday, June 3 Itinerary: Discover the Mount of Olives where Jesus ascended

into heaven. Walk the Palm Sunday Road to the Dominus Flevit. Then visit the Garden of Gethsemane where Iesus prayed to His father to have the "cup pass from Him." In the City of David, explore Hezekiah's Tunnel, an amazing feat of ancient engineering. Observe contemporary Jewish traditions when you come the Ierusalem markets before Shabbat. Then at the Western Wall watch the Shabbat call. If time allows, take an evening drive to see the illuminated city walls. Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight. (B, D) Hotel: Olive Tree



Saturday, June 4 Itinerary: Continue to Mount Zion to visit the House of the High Priest Caiaphas, where Jesus was questioned. Visit the Pool of Bethesda where Jesus healed the blind man. Perhaps raise your voice in song at St. Anne's Church. Then visit Herod's Antonia Fortress, where Jesus appeared before Pilate, and follow in Christ's footsteps on the Via Dolorosa. Reflect on Christ's crucifixion as you visit the traditional site of Calvary and give thanks for our risen Savior when you visit the Garden Tomb. Enjoy dinner in Joppa before your night flight. 

that our livestream can now be entirely contained in systems we control ourselves, independent of Facebook and YouTube.

Livestreaming to our website home page began on May 8, 2022. The website home page looks like this before the livestream becomes available:



The large black rectangle is the livestream window which is currently offline. Once the livestream becomes available at approximately 10:45 am on Sunday mornings, the black window activates automatically to show the livestream:



There is no Chat area, but there are a couple of controls available:



The speaker icon on the lower left allows you to mute or increase the sound volume, assuming that you have your home speakers turned on. The dashed line square icon on the far right allows you to enlarge the livestream to full screen size:



The number by the "eyeball" icon is a count of the number of people watching the embedded livestream:
