



# A conversation with Richard and Anjanette Inzunza

Q: When was your first day at CPFUMC and what do you remember about it?

# **LONDON Methodist Roots 2024**

Our next world faith adventure will be to England in summer of 2024. This is part of a seven year youth curriculum cycle intended to ground our faith roots in the legacy of our faith mothers and fathers. The Holy Land trip allowed to walk in the spaces and places of people seeking to engage God and responding to God's call. The Methodist Roots trip puts in the path walked by John Wesley the founder of Methodism. We will explore both his struggle and his life freed by grace which transformed the world. We will spend time between now and then learning of history of Methodism and the current means/missions of the Methodist church around the world. God calls us for the very transformation of the world by God's love.

Southern California, Northern California, Des Moines, Iowa, London, England, Chicago, IL and now Jonestown, TX.

Q: What church did you come to CPFUMC from?

A: Elmhurst FUMC in Elmhurst, IL. This is a very small church, not even half the size of CPFUMC.

Q: Tell us about your family.

A: We have a daughter, Shayna, who is 28. She moved to the Austin area in May after living in Chicago. She is a consultant to the food industry. Her company allows 100% remote work, so she decided to come to Texas.

Q: Do you have any pets?

A: We had a Jack Russell Terrier named Cash for 16 years. We lost our friend last September.

Q: What do you like to do in your spare time? Or what takes up a lot of your time?

A: Richard still works managing an investment portfolio for ERS. Anjanette spends time, almost daily, baking all types of bread products. Savory, sweet, pizza, American, Italian, Japanese, Asian, Middle Eastern. If it involves dough she can make it. We buy 25lb bags of flour and have not purchased a bread product in a few years.

Q: Do you have a particular hobby? Is there one you want to learn?

A: Anjanette is a competitive tennis player. She plays in multiple leagues several times per week. She was once on a team that was one tiebreaker result from going to the national championship for that division. Richard is a competitive shooter competing in USPSA matches.

Q: What's your favorite restaurant or favorite meal?

A: We cook regularly and it is fairly involved. You definitely wouldn't make this type of effort just because you are hungry. Anjanette makes anything with dough. Shayna is near a professional level chef. She worked on the business side of the #1 restaurant in America at one point. Richard handles the fires on the wood-fired oven, grill and smoker. Our favorite meal is Christmas dinner. We have been preparing a large Tomahawk steak cooked to temperature then seared on cast iron in the wood oven at 1000 degrees.

Q: Where is your favorite vacation locale?

A: We have travelled extensively, especially when we lived in London. However, our favorite trip was to Japan. We visited the large cities of Tokyo and Kyoto, but

the best part of the trip was going through the countryside in Western Japan.

Q: I'd rather do anything besides:

A: wait in line for a restaurant.

Q: Tell us something we might not know about you!

A: Anjanette was a 1<sup>st</sup> team All-City of Los Angeles basketball player in high school and was offered a college scholarship. Richard was once the #1 ranked bicycle racer in Illinois and the #4 in the U.S. in his division.

# New Computers Installed, Old Computers Sold

Our Technology Plan is being executed this summer. Two new computers were purchased and installed in the church. One new computer is used to run the slide show every Sunday during worship services. The other new computer was installed on the desk of Reanna Eddy, our Child's Haven director.

The new computers are Dell OptiPlex model 7090 small form factor machines with Intel Core i5-11500 processors, 16GB of RAM and 512 GB PCIe NVMe solid-state storage disks.

The computers that these new computers replaced were cascaded into our fleet of 14 computers and the resulting two oldest computers were combined with donated monitors, keyboard, mice, Wi-Fi adapters and

webcams to be sold off as complete systems to some lucky church members and friends who got a great deal.

After taking advantage of a Tech Soup discount coupon (10%), the gross cost of the two new computers was \$1,836.38. Child's Haven graciously picked up half the cost of one of the computers and sales proceeds from selling off the two older computer systems subsidized the cost by raising an additional \$450, so the net cost to the CPFUMC Technology Fund of two brand new Dell computers was only \$936.38.





# Narthex TV Installed

In their June 6 meeting the CPFUMC Trustees decided to improve the arrangement of the Narthex by mounting a TV to the wall instead of using the rolling cart TV parked in the corner by the coffee table. This TV is used to provide a weekly slide show that the church council had earlier requested to promoted the recent activities of the congregation and upcoming events.

On June 29<sup>th</sup> Neil and Jane Howard were able to get a new Narthex TV mounted on the wall behind the long table. The TV itself is a 4K TV and it has voice control via the remote. The TV remote, wireless keyboard and mouse for the Dell OptiPlex 5070 micro-computer are in the drawer of the Narthex visitor's desk.

The TV remote has a push and hold for voice commands and it takes two AAA batteries. You can push and hold down the mic button remote to say "Switch input to HDMI-1" and "Lower volume to 24." The PC is connected to our church network via both Wi-Fi and hardwired Ethernet. The TV is connected to our network via Wi-Fi only. There is a Vizio SmartCast Mobile app which can also be used to control the TV in case we somehow lose the remote. You have to pair your phone with the TV. This TV has Chromecast and Apple AirPlay built-in.

The total net cost of the Narthex TV project was \$790.89, paid for by the CPFUMC Technology Fund.







## **Church Finance Report**

The Church's operating fund financial status through June 30, 2022 is summarized below. June was another good month with generous giving for church operations. Most expenses were consistent with budgeted estimates, though there were one-time expenses that resulted in a small deficit for the month. Year-to-date the Church continues to have an operating deficit so your ongoing support is appreciated. The Church continues to have adequate cash reserves to meet its financial obligations.
