

2023 Stewardship Campaign

Our 2023 stewardship campaign starts on Sunday, November 6, 2022. This is a time when we ask you to think about what the Church means to you, and how you can help it be a blessing to you, our community and beyond.

Cedar Park First UMC continues to thrive and serve through challenging times due to your faithful support. During this past year Church attendance has steadily grown. Our mission giving this year looks like it will set a Church record. That giving helps Hill Country Community Ministries, Ukrainian refugees locally and through the United Methodist Committee on Relief, a Rwandan widow and other Church missions. Our Youth have served on mission trips and completed an amazing, and challenging, trip to the Holy Land.

There are many ways you can support the Church. You can attend worship, participate in adult education, volunteer with the youth and with the membership care and outreach committee and of course give financially. Pledging to give, for those who feel able, is very important to the Church. A pledge is just an estimate of what you can reasonably, faithfully expect to give for the coming year. It is not a contract and you can change it if needed.

In 2022 our pledges were 15% below the prior year. As a result the Church Council had a challenge budgeting for 2022. We budgeted our expenses very conservatively and hoped for other giving. Overall the 2022 budget grew by only 1.5% even though we knew we had to increase some line items due to expected inflation. And we have experienced increased costs for insurance, utilities, building maintenance and other costs. In 2022 we also experienced some unexpected costs, like having to replace a heating/air conditioning unit in the Multi-ministries Building, at a cost of almost \$10,000.

By pledging you help the Church better plan its ministries for 2023, you support our pastors, you help us maintain our renovated sanctuary and you support our children and youth programs. Soon you will receive a letter including a pledge card and on November 6th you will also have an opportunity to pick up a pledge card at both worship services. We ask you to prayerfully consider completing a pledge card. You can mail it back to the church, or you can turn it in during worship on Commitment Sunday, November 20, 2022. We ask that you also consider an additional gift for this year, to help us address a deficit in our current year finances.

We have been blessed at Cedar Park First UMC and we are called to be a blessing to others. We hope and pray that you think, and then act, on how you can help us continue to be that blessing.



Robert Schnase to Return to Rio Texas Conference as Episcopal Leader



HOUSTON - On the Thursday evening of the 2022 South Central Jurisdictional Conference, it was confirmed that Bishop Robert Schnase will continue as the Episcopal leader of the Rio Texas Conference. Schnase will also serve as the Episcopal leader for the New Mexico Conference.

This announcement was made when the SCJ Committee on the Episcopacy reported the assignments of the Bishops within the South Central Jurisdiction.

- Rio Texas Annual Conference Bishop Robert Schnase
- New Mexico Annual Conference Bishop Robert Schnase
- Texas Annual Conference Bishop Cynthia Fierro Harvey

These Episcopal Assignments will begin January 1, 2023.

"It is an honor and a privilege to return to the Rio Texas Conference," stated Bishop Schnase. "I will continue to serve two conferences with God's guidance and a lot of prayer. The people I have met the past six years in this conference are true servant leaders and I look forward to our continued ministry partnership. Rio Texas is my home and I'm energized by this reassignment."

Bishops are elected for life and serve in their assignment until retirement (required by the Book of Discipline to be the jurisdictional conference following their 68th birthday). Bishops are elected at Jurisdictional Conference and then are assigned to Episcopal Areas, which may include one or more Annual Conferences, within that Jurisdiction for a four-year term. Due to the pandemic and the rescheduling of the South Central Jurisdictional Conference, delegates will meet again in July 2024. Therefore, some assignments will be for two years.

During the 2022 South Central Jurisdictional Conference, delegates from the twelve annual conferences have gathered under the theme "Together in Christ; Rooted in Love." They heard reports and voted on business matters and worshiped together.
