

### **Year-End Reminders from the Church Finance Committee**

As we enter December and near the end of 2022, we want to remind everyone about the importance of making your 2022 contributions. You can take contributions you make prior to December 31st as a deduction on your income tax if you itemize your deductions. For those 70 1/2 and over, you can take a take tax credit for donations made from an IRA as a Qualified Charitable Distribution. The Church encourages you to make your December donations as early as possible. However, the Church will credit your 2022 contributions statement for any donations we receive by December 31, 2022.

In addition, if you have not yet made a pledge for 2023 it is still possible to do so. Your pledges help the Church better plan its expenses for 2023, support our pastors, youth and other ministries. We are pleased by the response so far, but we encourage anyone who has not yet made a pledge to consider doing so as soon as possible, but before year end.

### **Church Finance Report**

The Church's operating fund status through October 31, 2022 is summarized below. We had a positive October due in part to the results of our Pumpkin Patch. Though we did not sell all of the pumpkins, we did net a little over \$3000 enabling us to reduce our year to date deficit. The Church continues to have adequate cash reserves to meet its financial obligations.
