CPFUMC Technology Plan for 2023

Each year the church makes updates to our Technology Plan to address how we will use

technology and adapt to technology changes to support our ministries in the upcoming year. Our Technology Plan is prepared by the LAN Administrator and administered by the Trustees through approvals for expenditures from the Technology Fund, an off-budget designated fund. By purchasing 3 new computers in 2022, we made some progress in our goal of bringing all of the 14 church computers to have the capability to run Windows 11 before Microsoft ends Windows 10 support in October 2025. By

purchasing 2 new routers, we also made some needed updates to our Wi-Fi infrastructure to address the increasing use of the latest generation Wi-Fi 6. This really helped out in the multiministries building as our Child's Haven preschool went to a new online registration and check-in/ check-out system with relies on Wi-Fi and smartphones.

Our goal in 2023 is to get all church computers to the capability of running Windows 11 and then make the transition to Windows 11 in the summer of 2023. As of mid-December 2022, we still have 5 of our 14 computers which need to be upgraded to run Windows 11. By taking advantage of online sales, discount coupons via TechSoup, purchasing refurbished machines via Dell Outlet and cascading older machines to lesser-used roles, we plan to maximize our purchasing power to achieve our goal. Our current estimate, subject to Trustees approval in 2023, is to spend about \$4900 to purchase new and refurbished computers in 2023. The current balance of the Technology Fund is about \$6300, so we have enough money already in place to accomplish this goal. We expect the salvage value of the 5 computers we are replacing and one additional computer currently for sale will boost the Technology Fund balance a bit beyond its current \$6300 balance.

Christmas VBS: The Journey to Bethlehem

This year's Christmas VBS went very well. The kids learned about the journey Mary and Joseph took to Bethlehem and the struggles they faced, the shepherds learning about the birth of Jesus, and the Wise Men visiting the newborn King. They also had a lot of fun creating edible nativity scenes, planning Jesus' birthday party, and making ornaments to remember the birth of Jesus. I want to thank everyone for the donations and items that we were able to borrow to make this year's VBS such a success.
