

Suicide is a reality in our world and we often are at a loss about how to comfort those left to grieve (including ourselves perhaps) or what to do if someone presents signals about suicide. Below is description for a one-day class at Austin Seminary near UT. I will be attending and invite anyone whose heart has been tugged or bruised by this issue to join me in learning how to respond meaningfully to suicide. There is a \$50 fee which includes instruction, materials and lunch. The registration link can be found below. Soul ShopTM is a one-day workshop that equips faith community leaders to minister to suicide impacts as a regular aspect of their ministries. The workshop includes addressing the primary obstacles to dealing with suicide such as stigma, fear, and shame; statistics/facts about suicide; and how ministries can create a supportive environment while shifting the culture around how people deal with this subject and one another.

During the workshop we will talk about the creation of worship resources, training congregation members in suicide awareness and basic conversation skills, and how to extend the invitation to those who have been suicidal in the past to share their stories.

Who Should Attend? Faith leaders and benefits counselors, lay ministry leaders, first responders and essentially anyone interested in learning how to effectively minister to those impacted by suicide.

▼ READ ACROSS AMERICA AT A CHILD'S HAVEN ON MARCH 2

Read Across America Day, also known as Dr. Seuss Day, is a yearly observance in the USA inaugurated by the National Education Association (NEA). It is held on the school day that is nearest to March 2, Dr. Seuss's birthday. Theodor Seuss Geisel was an American artist, book publisher, animator, poet, and author of over 60 children's books.

NEA is an organization that represents public school teachers and other support personnel, staffers, and faculty at universities and colleges, as well as educators that have retired and college students who are preparing to become teachers.

In 1997 NEA launched the Read Across America, to encourage children to read more books and also get them excited about reading. On March 2, 1998, the first Read Across America Day was celebrated. Since then, it has been held annually.

The holiday mainly focuses on motivating children to read as it improves their performance in school. On this day, hospitals, bookstores, community centers, churches, libraries, and schools host many events to promote reading.

This year on Thursday, March 2, Cedar Park Church members are invited to Read Across America with the children at a Child's Haven from 10am-11:30pm. Sign up in the Sanctuary Lobby to read from one of Dr. Suess's books to a group of children for ten or fifteen minutes. What a great way to celebrate reading!!
