


time when they are to boast about their talent. This is not mandatory but we do encourage all children to participate.







### Short-Term Disciple Bible Study on Genesis to be Offered

Pastor Peter will be leading a 10-session Disciple Bible Study on the book of Genesis. This study will take persons into the rich tapestry of Genesis to explore the interaction between God and some very human people. The best-known stories of Creation, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph will be considered.

The Bible will serve as the primary text in this study, but a Participant Guide will also be utilized. Preparation on the part of participants is expected: two chapters of Genesis will be read each week, as well as a segment of the Participant Guide. The Participant Guide is also used for note taking and responding to reflection questions that follow each lesson.

After preparation during the week, participants will gather each Thursday from 10:15am until noon for small group discussion and video presentations by scholars, who will help unpack the meaning and the mystery in the stories. Participants for this Invitation to Genesis do not have to have an in-depth knowledge of the Bible to enjoy and benefit from participation.

If you are interested in attending this study, a sign-up sheet is available in the Sanctuary Lobby. The cost of the study is \$20, which covers the cost of the Participation Guide. The class begins October 5 and runs through December 8. Please consider taking part in this exciting journey through Genesis.

Christianity share, as well as differences.

As Sheik Fazaga explained, for Muslims the Ouran is the word of Allah, Arabic for God. It addresses the nature of God, messengers of God, the hereafter, things that are permitted and things not permitted and directs humanity to a better relationship with God. Islam recognizes Adam, Moses, Abraham and Jesus as well as the Prophet Mohammed as messengers of God. In Islam salvation comes from personal responsibility accompanied bv God's acceptance and mercy. Islam does not fully share the Christian concept of God's grace,

His unmerited love and forgiveness.

While many Old Testament stories exist in both the Bible and Quran there are differences. Christian theology represents the Adam and Eve story as the basis for original sin. The Quran does not have a similar

understanding. In its telling, Adam and Eve are forgiven and their sin did not affect future generations.

The story of Cain and Abel are virtually the same in the Bible and Quran. However, in the Hebrew scriptures, Abel was favored by God due to his more acceptable sacrifice. In the Quran, Abel was favored because he was virtuous and Cain was wicked. In the Hebrew scriptures Noah was chosen because he was an upright man and the entire earth was destroyed by flood due to mankind's wickedness. In the Quran, Noah was presented as a believer chosen to warn people to believe. When they did not, God caused the flood, but not of the entire world. These dialogues are consistent with a resolution passed at the 2016 United Methodist Church General Conference. The resolution called upon Christians to initiate and promote better relationships between Christians and Muslims on the basis of informed understanding, critical appreciation, and balanced perspective of one another's basic beliefs. It urged local congregations and United Methodist agencies to develop ongoing relationships with Muslims and their respective organizations, including conversations, programs, and dialogues leading to better understanding and areas of



mutual cooperation.

At these dialogues, CPFUMC and members of the Brushy Creek Islamic Center displayed great openness and hospitality to each other. Due to the interest, a series of evening dialogues will be held in October and November. I encourage you to look for announcement of specific dates, time and location. Our Church's mission includes saying we are committed to peace. Interfaith dialogues are an excellent way to promote peace and mutual respect in these complicated times.
