BOOKS TO FEED YOUR FAITH: GREAT READS FOR UNITED METHODISTS

Summer is a wonderful time for a good book, but it can be a challenge to choose one.

We asked our friends at <u>The United Methodist Publishing House</u> and <u>Abingdon Press</u> to recommend some great reads that would feed our faith this summer. They told us about 10 wonderful books to enjoy by the pool, at the beach, or in a favorite chair.



A Fragile Hope by Cynthia Ruchti – Josiah Chamberlain's work revolves around repairing other people's marriages. When his own is threatened by his wife's unexplained distance, and then threatened further when she's unexpectedly plunged into an unending fog, Josiah finds his expertise, quick wit and clever quips are no match for a relationship that is clearly broken.
 Follow Chamberlain as he reexamines everything he knows about the fragility of hope and the strength

of his faith and love. Will what's left of his faith fail him? Or will it be the one thing that holds him and his marriage together?



Pond River Ocean Rain: Find Peace in the Storms of Life by Charles Lattimore Howard – Wade into the beautiful water that is God through stories, questions, and accessible illustrations. Feel the Living Water wash over you while contemplating stillness (such as a pond), trust in God's will (like the rush of a river), peace within mystery (as experienced in the depths of the ocean), and the movement of God's relentless love for us (the refreshing rain we receive).

Pond River Ocean Rain is simple, occasionally wild, consistently beautiful, and reveals abundant life for all who jump in.




Dwelling Places: Words to Live in Every Season by Lucinda Secrest McDowell – What if a thriving, active faith were as simple as reading one word a day? If you're tired of busyness and noise, perhaps one word a day can change your life.
