

CAPITAL DISTRICT NEWS

The Fall Charge Conference season continues, but will soon be coming to an end. It's been a good and full season for me. I enjoy connecting with our local churches at this time of year. We conduct necessary business. But we also pray for saints who have gone on to glory. We affirm candidates for ministry. And every encounter leaves me learning something new about the ways you are being the church. I am grateful for you!

I also know that I am running out of steam a bit. I rarely sense it first in my energy level and stamina. The signs instead show up in my temperament. If I don't notice it first, those closest to me no doubt do. My irritability increases. My patience decreases. Earlier this week I was about to hit a wall. (Or maybe I did.) The breaking point had nothing to do with charge conference forms or consultation forms. Instead, it was trying to find Clare's shoes for my brother's upcoming wedding. Do you know how difficult it is to find the right dress shoes for a 7 year old who is as tall as she is and who has a foot as wide as hers is? My dear husband finally informed me that I was to no longer look for the shoes and that he would take care of it. And he did. Next week we host Thanksgiving Day dinner at the district parsonage for our family and I will try and let others help and take care of things on that day, too.

One of my favorite Anne Lamott quotes goes like this:

Gratitude begins in our hearts and then dovetails into behavior. It almost always makes you willing to be of service, which is where the joy resides. It means that you are willing to stop being such a jerk. When you are aware of all that has been given to you, in your lifetime and the past few days, it is hard not to be humbled, and pleased to give back.

I've not often been called a jerk. (At least not to my face!) But in moments when I am self aware and honest, I can identify such behavior in myself. It usually comes at times when I get worked up and stressed out about things that are, in the end, of no real consequence. Like wedding shoes and the right Thanksgiving appetizers.

I don't know how it is with your soul this season. But I pray you exercise self care and spiritual disciplines that keep you close to God, family and those you serve. It is a busy time with the busier season of Advent and Christmas upon us. May the joy of Christ dwell fully in us as we prepare to live into all that is ahead.
