God Loves All Bodies Barbara Brown Taylor shares her experience of falling in love with human bodies, her own and others. She writes in An Altar in the World:

Our bodies are prophets. They know when things are out of whack and they say so, although most of us welcome their news about as warmly as the people of Jerusalem welcomed Jeremiah's. We would rather lock up our bodies than listen to what they have to say. Where Christians are concerned, this leaves us in the peculiar position of being followers of the Word Made Flesh who neglect our own flesh or—worse—who treat our bodies with shame and scorn.

What many of us miss, in our physical dis-ease, is that our bodies remain God's best way of getting to us. . . Deep suffering makes theologians of us all. The questions people ask about God in Sunday school rarely compare with the questions we ask while we are in the hospital.

## **Volunteer Roles & Descriptions:**

- Sports Helpers Assist in teaching children sports skills and setting up and taking down equipment for a particular sport: Basketball (Head Coach: Gigi), Soccer (Head Coach: Elizabeth), Cheerleading (Head Coach: Colleen), and Martial Arts has not yet confirmed, but we're hoping they can join us again this year
- **Bible Time Huddle Coaches** Lead group discussion with children regarding the bible verse and story. There is a packet of stories/questions that you can use to guide this discussion.
- Kitchen/Concessions Help Assist Sue, our Concession Coach, in planning, preparing, and serving snacks and refreshments
- First Aid/Safety CPR/First aid trained individual who gives safety reminder at beginning of day (drink water, take breaks, play safe & don't wander off), and gives ice packs or band-aids to injured children
- Registration Assist parents with checking in children from 5:15-6:15pm, and monitor children at 8pm as they are released to their parents
- **Pre-Game Coaches** Monitor children from 5:15-6pm with provided crafts and games (duck duck goose, Simon says, etc.), and help demonstrate the rally dance with video
- Watchers Trusted con Confianza trained individuals who can monitor children to make sure they are safe, but do not need to assist with sports or lead the Bible time huddle (although you are more than welcome to volunteer for those roles in addition)

#### A WORD FROM TERESA



#### Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

What a joy it is to live into the Easter season. Like other holidays and church seasons, Easter brings back for me a flood of childhood memories. One of my fondest is the adult Easter egg hunts at my grandparents' house. My grandparents had a spacious backyard complete with good climbing trees, lots of patio furniture, and garden beds sprinkled throughout. In other words, it was perfect for hiding eggs. I'm not sure when

the tradition started, but for years I recall the two Easter egg hunts held at my grandparent's home. One for the children. One for the adults. I can still picture my aunts and uncles and even great aunts climbing trees and arguing about who saw which egg first. I pray you have had time to reflect on Easters past and to create some new memories.

The Easter season spreads before us for days and weeks leading up to Christ's Ascension and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. When I consider other times in the church calendar, it seems the time goes by all too quickly. We are given Advent to prepare for the birth of Christ. And while most years I'd like a sensible 9 months, we are given just four weeks. After the birth, Jesus grows up super fast. Within days of remembering His birth, we see Him as a young adult being baptized. Then, with the baptismal waters still fresh upon Him, we move into Lent and get 40 days to consider the breadth of His ministry that lead to His crucifixion and ultimately resurrection.

But then Easter comes and the Christian calendar gives us ample time to hangout in the Easter season. Fifty days, in fact.

What does it mean to receive this gift of the Easter season? In part, it is accepting the invitation to recall the various encounters people had with the resurrected Christ. Mary who hears her risen Lord telling her to let go and bear witness to all she has seen. Thomas whose questioning faith led him to touch the wounds of Christ. Other disciples experienced the risen Christ's presence when they broke bread with Him. Still others who went fishing only to find Jesus sharing breakfast with them afterwards.

Receiving the gift of an Easter season is also an invitation to practice resurrection ourselves. We do that in our own lives when we strive to see something in a new way or when we take on a new challenge. We do that in our churches when we not only hope for something new to happen but also take action to join God's work of making all things new. We do that in our world when we choose to stand up for the marginalized and to speak out about injustice. As many preachers before have shared, resurrection is a hard message to sell in what seems to be a Good Friday world. And yet, we are called to do precisely that - to bear witness to Love's redeeming work by how we live the very precious lives we have been given. Poet Wendell Berry urges us to practice resurrection in his *Manifesto: The Mad Farmer Liberation Front*. Among the lines are these: "Love the Lord. Love the world. Work for nothing....Love someone who does not deserve it....Ask the questions that have no answers...Be joyful though you have considered all the facts."

When I visited my grandparents' home in the summer, my siblings and I would inevitably stumble across an overlooked Easter egg when playing in the backyard. Still buried under leaves and grass, the Easter egg called to mind a day of celebration and joy. I don't know about you, but I need to be reminded constantly to practice resurrection. To look at my very life and make different choices - better choices - that will lead to life abundant for all the other lives my own bumps up against in this world. To remember the day we rejoiced in Love's redeeming work and to claim that like Jesus, today we, too can rise to new life. Alleluia!

Blessings of joy and wonder as you live into this season and practice resurrection!
