

#### What do they do?

Website – Statistics show that 80% of church visitors first visit the website before they visit the church. Our original function was to plan and create a completely refreshed website for CPFUMC. This was done in 2016. It involved a lot of research into the technologies available and the way that a church website is organized. Dave Sidney helped us get started with GoDaddy for hosting our website. Our home page is designed for visitors. We also took some time to create a team to maintain the website and keep its content fresh and interesting. Neil and Kevin created and now maintain most of the pages, Ed handles updating the Find Out What's Happening page and Sue and Carolyn keep the church calendar up-to-date. We do an annual review of the website with the 19 web content contributors to make sure that the content is still relevant. Our website has grown to 47 pages and it gets an average of over 2800 pageviews per month with an average session duration of 3:25. 89.9% of our visitors are from the USA. We had 1 visitor from Zimbabwe!

**Facebook** – In 2017 we decided that the old church Facebook page needed a refresh as well. This is where Colleen and Carolyn's daughter, Alexandra, came in. Colleen is currently maintaining our new Facebook page as this form of social media has become more important.

**Twitter** – When we built the website in 2016, Twitter was a rage, so we decided to get a church Twitter account. Bonnie does most of our tweeting.

**YouTube** – We created a CPFUMC YouTube channel in 2016. It was originally used as a place to post videos of the Christmas dramas done by our elementary Sunday School classes. Since then it has grown to accommodate videos of VBS, the MOS construction and most recently our stellar recycling project education video, *Think Before You Toss*.

You can follow us on any of these social media sites. They are cross-linked to each other in varying degrees. Links to all of our social media sites are found in the footer section of each page on our website.

Besides creating, maintaining and managing our online presence, the Communication/Web team is responsible for our regular church publications which come in both electronic and hardcopy formats.


posts these weekly missives to the Find Out What's Happening page on our website where the last 4 weeks are maintained.

**Connections** – Jill Lundstrom does a great job editing our monthly newsletter, *Connections*. Jill takes input from anyone who submits an article. She adds the calendar of events and produces both electronic and hardcopy versions of Connections with hardcopy production help from Carolyn.

Worship Bulletins and Worship Slides – Worship bulletins are prepared each week by Peter, copied by Kevin and folded by the "Church Ladies" who convene each Friday morning for coffee. Kevin does all of the worship slides and the Weekly Events slides which roll onscreen each Sunday. This is a huge job and Kevin has become very proficient at generating PowerPoint slideshows.

#### **Hygiene Kits**

We will be collecting the following items to assemble kits that provide the basic necessities needed by individuals who have been forced to leave their homes by natural disasters or conflicts. The hygiene kits are also used in as a learning tool in personal hygiene, literacy, nutrition and cooking classes. Each kit has a value of \$12.

#### **Items requested:**

**1 hand towel:** 15 x 25 inches to 17 by 27 inches (NOT kitchen, nor microfiber)

1 washcloth

**1 comb:** Longer than 6 inches (no picks, nor pocket combs)

**1 metal nail file or clippers** (No emery boards)

**1 bath-size soap:** 3 oz or larger, don't unwrap (no Ivory, nor Jergens)

1 toothbrush: Adult size, don't unwrap


6 band-aids: 3/4inch to 1inch size

1 plastic bag: Sealable gallon-size only

**\$1 for buying toothpaste:** in an envelope

#### SHORT-TERM DISCIPLE BIBLE STUDY ON PSALMS TO BE OFFERED



This summer Pastor Peter will be leading a 10-session Disciple Bible Study on the Book of Psalms, beginning June 14. This study will allow participants to make a deeper connection to the world of the Psalms. These well-known Scriptures can help you give voice to all aspects of our human experience – joy, faith, uncertainty, and sorrow.

The Bible will serve as the primary text in this study, but a Participant Guide will also be utilized. Preparation on the part of participants is expected before class: several Psalms will be read each week, as well as a segment of the Participant Guide. The Participant Guide is also used for note-taking and responding to reflection questions that follow each lesson.

After preparation during the week, participants will gather each Thursday from 10:30am until noon for small group discussion. Each week we will also view two video segments, which will present individual Psalm texts in a variety of ways, including dramatic reading, music, dance, and images, as well as offer insights into specific Psalms by biblical scholars in an informal, roundtable conversation format.

Participants for this Invitation to Psalms do not have to have an in-depth knowledge of the Bible to enjoy and benefit from participating.

If you are interested in attending this study, a sign-up sheet is available on the back table in the Sanctuary. The cost of the study is \$16, which will pay for the Participation Guide. The class begins June 14 and runs through August 16. Please consider taking part in this exciting journey through the Psalms.
