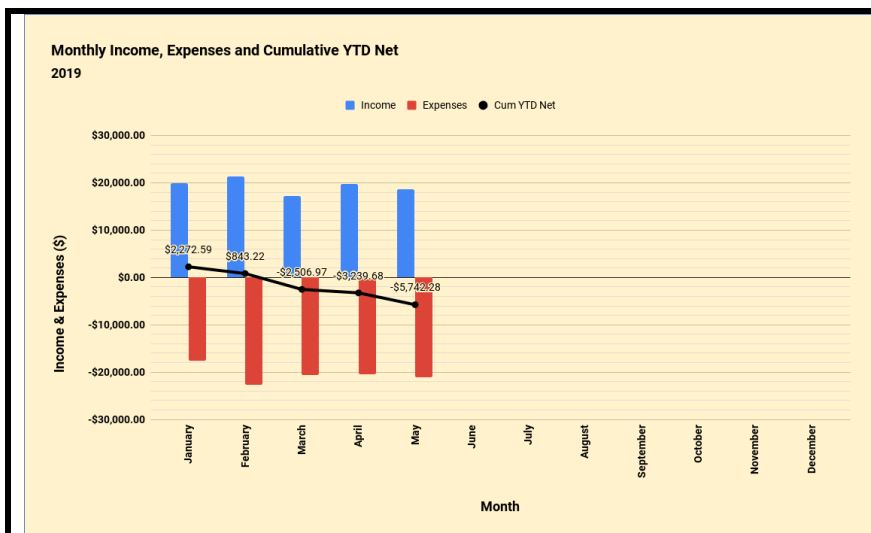

MONTHLY INCOME, EXPENSES AND CUMULAIVE YTD NET



Explanation

The chart depicts monthly income and expenses for the church using solid blue and solid red bars.

The net for a given month is the income minus the expenses for that month.

The cumulative net is indicated by the solid black line. It is the year-to-date (YTD) summation of all the monthly nets.

If the Cum YTD Net is above zero, that means we are running a surplus to date.

If the Cum YTD Net is negative, that means we are running a deficit to date.

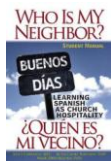

Who makes decisions for The United Methodist Church if there is no one person in charge? Good question. The only body that can set official policy and speak for the denomination is the General Conference.

The General Conference is an international body of nearly 1,000 delegates that generally meets every four years.

In the United States of America, The United Methodist Church is divided into five areas known as jurisdictions: Northeastern, Southeastern, North Central, **South Central** and Western. These provide some program and leadership training events to support the annual conferences. Every four years the jurisdictional

The delegates are elected by annual conferences (at annual conference sessions) to attend General Conference. They represent all annual conferences around the world. Half of the delegates are laity (non-clergy members), half are clergy.

Bishops attend the General Conference but cannot vote.

Different bishops serve as presiding officers during the conference. Other bishops cannot speak unless permission is specifically granted by the delegates.

During General Conference, delegates discuss and vote on petitions and resolutions proposed by individuals, agencies, annual conferences, and other groups within the denomination. These actions result in a revision of the Book of Discipline, the denomination's book of law, and Book of Resolutions, policies of the denomination on current social issues.

It is at General Conference where delegates wrestle with today's issues in light of scriptural teachings and the church's understanding of that teaching. Here is where the church's official stands and church policies are made regarding such issues as human sexuality, abortion, war and peace, as well as determination of ministries and funding.

General Conferences are generally held in years divisible by 4, such as 2008, 2012, 2016, etc., with the exception of special sessions.

conferences meet to elect new bishops and select members of general boards and agencies.

Annual conferences located outside the United States are organized into central conferences, much like jurisdictions. There are seven central conferences: Africa, Central and Southern Europe, Congo, Germany, Northern Europe, Philippines, and West Africa.

The South Central Jurisdiction of the United Methodist Church covers eight states, Arkansas, Kansas, Louisiana, Missouri, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas. There are eleven Annual Conferences in this Jurisdiction, supervised by ten Episcopal leaders.

(1) Arkansas, (2) Central Texas (3) Great Plains: Nebraska & Kansas, (4) Louisiana, (5) Missouri, (6) New Mexico, (7) North Texas (8), Northwest Texas, (9) Oklahoma (10) Rio Texas, (11) Texas

The Jurisdiction owns three institutions, Southern Methodist University, including Perkins School of Theology, Lydia Patterson Institute, a school for mainly Hispanic children, located in El Paso, TX, Another United Methodist seminary in the Jurisdiction is Saint Paul School of Theology.
