Trustees Upgrade Wi-Fi

Last December when we got the new, more powerful wireless access point in the Sanctuary Building, we put the old (vintage 2010) router in the Nursery to extend our Wi-Fi signal outside the Sanctuary building. Well, that old router and its connection to our church network and the Internet finally died sometime in July.

Diagnosis

Since that old router was the main remote connection to our Wi-Fi-enabled irrigation system, we could no longer communicate with our Wi-Fi irrigation controller. The irrigation controller still operated just fine since its program is self-contained, but we could not easily and remotely change it or view any watering data. Part of the problem was not only the old router, but also the power line adapters used to extend our wired network from the Sanctuary to the Nursery using the building's 120v power wiring. Once the old router was replaced, the intermittent connection problem and inability to ping ultimately persisted, necessitating replacement of the power line adapters as well.

The New Setup

The new router is a TP-Link model AC1900 Archer C9. This is a dual band router (2.4GHz and 5GHz) set up as a Wireless



Access Point. We got this router because it is fairly modern (first released in 2017), much more powerful than our old Netgear N300 router, it has a form factor that allows it to be mounted in the Nursery window, it is white (which blends in somewhat with the surrounding paint, curtains and blinds) and it was reasonably priced on Amazon. The replacement power line adapters are TP-Link model AV1000 devices. These are a nice upgrade from the older ones because they work (!), they can "pair" to make an encrypted data channel and they seem to operate across electrical wiring circuits. This is good because the Nursery and the Conference Room where these are now installed are on different electrical wall power circuits. There is no longer a power line adapter

in the Sanctuary near the corner bookcase. It was moved it to the Conference Room behind the couch. All of the new equipment was donated.

The advantages of the new setup are

- A much stronger and more reliable Wi-Fi signal to connect our irrigation system to our network and the Internet.
- Much stronger Wi-Fi signals outside the Sanctuary building in the NE direction.
- 2.4GHz Wi-Fi signals at the road sign are now 220 MB/s. Previously this was 18 MB/s.
- 5GHz Wi-Fi signals at the road sign are now on the order of 380 MB/s.

This will come in handy when we ultimately upgrade our road sign. It may also

help in The Pumpkin Patch, depending on where we put the pumpkins and point-of-sale equipment.

For your reference, the list of Wi-Fi networks available at the church is now

- 1. CPFUMC (2.4GHz, MMB)
- 2. CPFUMC-5G (5GHz, MMB)
- 3. CPFUMC-2 (2.4/5 GHz, Sanctuary building)
- 4. CPFUMC-2A (2.4GHz, Sanctuary building)
- 5. CPFUMC-2B5 (5 GHz, Sanctuary building)

All of these Wi-Fi networks at the church have the same Wi-Fi password: Genesis11.

women from Hartford Seminary. Since then, these gifts of love have been given in times of sorrow and loss, to those facing health issues or surgeries, or those facing other difficult times. Shawls are also given in times of celebration: births, weddings, birthdays, anniversaries, ordinations, and graduations.

This ministry is based in love and combines needlework and prayer into a tangible, unconditional symbol of care, concern, and celebration. I have heard many stories from recipients of prayer shawls describing what the shawls have meant to them. I'd like to share a few with you.

One woman was having twins and took her prayer shawl to the hospital with her. She said she always thought it was "nice" that we give shawls, but when she put hers around her, she felt the prayers and it gave her peace. She also said it gave her the opportunity to share her faith with others when they commented on her shawl.

A friend's brother had gotten very ill and went into a coma. She asked if we'd pray over a shawl for him. We did and she took it to the hospital and talked to him about it, put it over him, and at that time he briefly opened his eyes and talked to them before going back into the coma.

A lady in North Carolina who had received a prayer shawl, asked if we'd make a traveling prayer shawl for their church so they could pass it to different people in need. We did and she later requested another because they couldn't take it from the lady who had it and still needed it, but there was another need.


Many others were touched by the fact that people they didn't know were praying for them.

So many stories and they weren't the only ones blessed. The ladies making the shawls and praying over them are blessed by their stories, pictures that are sent, etc. No matter how many shawls we make and pray over, we are blessed more and more by their stories, and reactions. 
