Top Court To Look At Church Disaffiliation Rules

EVANSTON, III. (UM News) — An amended request from the Council of Bishops now asks the denomination's top court to consider the implications of the General Conference Commission's finding that four ineligible voters cast a ballot during votes on disaffiliation legislation. The amended request is part of the 18-item docket when the United Methodist Judicial Council meets Oct. 29-Nov.1.
