

Count Me In!

A small group of people have belonged to a new committee at Church this year, the Stewardship Ideas Committee. Our tenure is over, and we wanted to share the outcome of all our brainstorming sessions. We were charged with coming up with a fresh approach to the annual pledge campaign and also with creating a narrative budget.

Instead of having the usual two-week campaign in November to ask just for monetary pledges from the Congregation as usual, we pondered an expanded pledge drive to address the needs of our church throughout the year, Year-Around Stewardship.



How to Put Holy Back into Christmas

It was the day after Halloween and a full three weeks before Thanksgiving. I had just come home from shopping and all I had heard throughout the stores were Christmas carols. When I turned on the TV, I was bombarded by garish advertisements that hit me in the face to Buy! ... Buy! ... Buy! all kinds of things for Christmas. All I could think was that the Christmas season has become too commercial

It wasn't like this when I was growing up. At this rate of change, stores might begin Christmas sales right after Labor Day in the future. This is just wrong. Buy! Buy! Buy! is not the message of Christmas. The real reason for the season is something that Christians should hold dear to their hearts. It is a time for reflection, waiting and awe. This is when God sent His Son to the world as a baby and had Him live His life as a person among us.

Think about how we celebrate this season today. Then reflect on the messages we are sending our children. What active steps can we take to instill in our children the importance of this date and of our beliefs? I asked several people about what they would do to put the Holy back into Christmas.

These are some of their suggestions you can share with your families:

- 1. On the first day of Advent make a loop out of construction paper. Have the children decorate a daily loop and connect them to make a chain. You can put it on a tree or use it to decorate their rooms. Some people put this chain out each year as decoration.
- 2. Get a small nativity set to have in their rooms. It could be made with cloth or resin. Hobby Lobby is full of small and large sets of the nativity scene. Put the Kings in the east part of the room and make the children move them closer and closer as Epiphany arrives. Wait to put the baby in the manger until Christmas Eve.

North Central Jurisdiction

Jurisdiction repents of harm to LGBTQ people

WHEELING, III. — General and jurisdictional delegates from the North Central Jurisdiction released a statement acknowledging and apologizing for harm to LGBTQ individuals in the past and for potential harm that could begin Jan. 1, 2020, when the Traditional Plan goes into effect. That plan strengthened church restrictions against ordination of gay clergy and same-sex unions. The delegates also called for a moratorium on complaints related to same-gender weddings and LGBTQ identity and credentialing, and said they want to elect bishops in 2020 who will join in these commitments.

The Refuge is a 21-building labor of love nestled among the Bastrop County pine trees. The Refuge is a long-term, residential, therapeutic community for girls, minors through age 19, who have been rescued out of sex trafficking. Built from the ground up on 50 acres in a beautiful and restorative setting, The Refuge provides trauma-informed, holistic care for the girls on site, including: a University of Texas Charter School program, a medical clinic staffed by community partners and various therapeutic programs uniquely designed for the development of a child survivor. The Refuge, with 48 beds, is the largest long-term, live-in rehabilitation facility for child survivors of sex trafficking in the United States. Statistics show that child sex trafficking is the fastest growing crime in the world and that there was an 846% increase in reported child sex trafficking cases from 2010 to 2015 in the United States alone.
