


A BEGINNER'S GUIDE to ADVENT

children during high school or middle school. They provide childcare specifically for these parent(s) who would have dropped out of school due to lack of childcare. **acts of LOVE** wants to see the children grow and learn in a warm and nurturing environment and help young parents continue their education and graduate from high school. By giving these young mothers the opportunity to complete their education, **acts of LOVE** is laying the foundation for their future as mothers, providers, employees, and citizens of their community.



**The Refuge** for DMST™ (Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking) was launched in November 2013 and is a registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. **The Refuge** is a 21-building labor of love nestled among the Bastrop County pine trees. **The Refuge** is a long-term, residential, therapeutic community for girls, minors through age 19, who have been rescued out of sex trafficking. Built from the ground up on 50 acres in a beautiful and restorative

setting, **The Refuge** provides trauma-informed, holistic care for the girls on site, including: a University of Texas Charter School program, a medical clinic staffed by community partners and various therapeutic programs uniquely designed for the development of a child survivor. **The Refuge**, with 48 beds, is the largest long-term, live-in rehabilitation facility for child survivors of sex trafficking in the United States. Statistics show that child sex trafficking is the fastest growing crime in the world and that there was an 846% increase in reported child sex trafficking cases from 2010 to 2015 in the United States alone. for the season is something that Christians should hold dear to their hearts. It is a time for reflection, waiting and awe. This is when God sent His Son to the world as a baby and had Him live His life as a person among us.

Think about how we celebrate this season today. Then reflect on the messages we are sending our children. What active steps can we take to instill in our children the importance of this date and of our beliefs? I asked several people about what they would do to put the Holy back into Christmas. These are some of their suggestions you can share with your families:

If there are small children in your family these are a few suggestions.

- 1. On the first day of Advent make a loop out of construction paper. Have the children decorate a daily loop and connect them to make a chain. You can put it on a tree or use it to decorate their rooms. Some people put this chain out each year as decoration.
- 2. Get a small nativity set to have in their rooms. It could be made with cloth or resin. Hobby Lobby is full of small and large sets of the nativity scene. Put the Kings in the east part of the room and make the children move them closer and closer as Epiphany arrives. Wait to put the baby in the manger until Christmas Eve.
- 3. For older children stringing popcorn for the tree is a delicious way to make a tree decoration.
- 4. Have the children of all ages put on a play about the nativity. Sheets make wonderful shepherds robes. Preparing for Christmas was a wonderful time in my house.
- 5. Have the children do a small devotional during Advent, perhaps prompted by an Advent calendar.

For families that have older children, there are many places that welcome your assistance in bringing the Christmas season to families that need help. Maybe the children in your home can help select toys for a toy campaign (fire stations, senior centers are just a couple of the collection points) so they can learn that giving to others makes for a fulsome happy heart. Choosing cans of food for the box in the Narthex which supports the Hill Country Community Ministries. This food not only helps feed other children, but also families. Putting coins in the Salvation Army Kettle or putting gifts of warm socks under Angel Trees are other ways to give to families in need at this time.

For adults, one could read a devotional each day. We have devotional booklets on the back table in the Sanctuary. And when decorating your tree, put on items that have special meaning to the family. Don't forget to tell the story, "you were in Kindergarten when you made this ornament. Your teacher said you were humming a Christmas song the whole time you worked on it." It is these stories that help cement the wonder of the season. Traditions are important.

There will be several services at Church a family could attend together. One that is especially fun is the 5pm Children's Service with the Children's Play. And Christmas Eve is a good time to read the Advent story to the family.

Think how you can apply these steps to your family. I hope this article helps you to find more ways to put the Holy back into Christmas this year.
