#### I GIVE ELECTRONICALLY

Cedar Park FUMC is excited to announce that you can now manage your giving online!

Giving online is easy and allows you to set up one-time or automatic recurring contributions and view your complete online giving history from anywhere you have access to the Internet.

Simply follow these easy steps:

#### **CHURCH MORTGAGE REFINANCED**

Our church has a mortgage with the Texas Methodist Foundation (TMF). As of February 29, 2020, our mortgage principal balance was \$332,725 and we make a monthly payment of \$2,920 at an interest rate of 4.5%. The payoff date for this loan is in August 2035. The terms of our current mortgage include a provision that resets the interest rate every 5 years to a value equal to the current Wall Street Journal prime interest rate plus 1.25%. The next 5-year reset date is September 7, 2020.

Due to generous contributions from church members over the last 5 years, we have been able to pay down the principal of this loan at a rate greater than the normal monthly payment of \$2,920. During a recent meeting with a representative of TMF, we discovered that we can refinance our mortgage to reduce our monthly mortgage payment and still pay off the loan in August 2035.

After considering several refinance options provided by TMF, the Finance Committee has agreed to apply to refinance our mortgage loan at an interest rate of 4.25% subject to reset every 3 years at the then current Wall Street Journal prime interest rate. This refinancing resolution has been signed and sent to TMF. It is expected to reduce our monthly payment to approximately \$2,480, a monthly savings of about \$440. Yea!

#### FREE THE PATH OF HOPE: A STUDY ON CLIMATE ACTION FOR FAITH COMMUNITIES

Bee Moorhead is excited to announce the release of **Texas Impact's** new climate change study guide for faith communities! **The Path of Hope: A Study on Climate Action for Faith Communities** is a small group, discussion-based series that leads even first-time climate advocates into powerful climate policy action. Special thanks to Trish Merrill and University United Methodist Church of Austin, and Mel Caraway and Grace Avenue United Methodist Church of Frisco, for piloting the study and helping us get it right.

For any Sunday school or other small group itching to "take action" on climate justice, this study is your one-stop shop!

The study includes: · (!) four 15-minute videos (2) discussion guide and meeting template
(3) recommended advocacy projects and action planner (4) additional video and written resources
The study is **designed** to be used in four 1-hour sessions, including video viewing times, but the content is

highly flexible and easily customizable. Group leaders will appreciate the study's helpful guidance on structuring discussions around tough topics, and ready-to-implement advocacy actions that include practical checklists and printable templates.

**The Path of Hope** is responsive to people of faith who want to move from personal environmental stewardship to climate policy advocacy. The videos clarify the often-obscure language of global climate policy, and demonstrate the critical need for strong US climate leadership—especially headed into COP26, the global climate negotiations set for November 2020 in Glasgow, Scotland.

### God is with us. We are not alone. Thanks be to God! By Teresa Welborn,

As news about the coronavirus continued to unfold, I learned a lot.

- I learned there are many prayers to pray and songs to sing while washing my hands thoroughly for 20 seconds.
- I learned I touch my face too much.
- I learned some people buy more toilet paper than they need.
- I learned a new phrase social distancing. I learned it saves lives.
- I learned through many conversations this week how hard it is for a local church pastor to make the decision to not have in person Sunday morning worship services.
- I learned how courageous pastors are in trying new and creative ways to tend to their communities.
  - Livestreaming and Facebook live for the first time; a YouTube channel guickly assembled.
- I learned how generous church members are in giving their time and talent for the development of worship experiences online.
- I learned that because of everyone's hard, creative work I could worship with literally dozens of churches throughout the day. In my yoga pants.
- I learned that when not going out for a few days I tend to wear the same comfortable yoga pants for a long, long time. And I haven't done much actual yoga.
- I pray in this time that feels heavy and bizarre, we will continue to learn together and open ourselves to all God desires to reveal to us.

It is no small thing to ponder what it means to be going through all of this during the Lenten season. We have entered a wilderness not of our own choosing where we are called to rely not on our own power to save ourselves but on God alone who invites us to a glorious and new resurrection life. As Sister Joan Chittister writes, "Lent is a growing season. It requires us to determine what is worth dying for in our own lives and what it may be necessary for us to become if we want to live."

I believe that in the months and years ahead, we will reflect back with greater perspective on all we learned during this season.

For now, hold fast to the knowledge that God is with you. We are not alone! Thanks be to God!

And if there was ever a time for us to be gentle with one another, it is now. Many in our churches and community will know God is with them because of a phone call, a handwritten note, a gesture of kindness. As we practice social distancing, may we deepen our practices of caring for one another in ways new and old. As Rabbi Yosef Kanefsky recently said, "Every hand that we don't shake must become a phone call that we place. Every embrace that we avoid must become a verbal expression of warmth and concern. Every inch and every foot that we physically place between ourselves and another must become a thought as to how we might be of help to that other, should the need arise."
