On **PenteCost Sunday**, we remember the day the disciples received the Holy Spirit in a special way. The story in <u>Acts 2</u> describes a powerful wind and tongues of fire as the Holy Spirit was poured out on people from all over the world who came to Jerusalem to celebrate a Jewish feast. At the first Pentecost over 3000 people were baptized, creating the first church. This is why Pentecost is known as the <u>birthday of the Christian church</u>.

The word <u>Pentecost</u> comes from a Greek word meaning fiftieth. The Jewish Festival of Pentecost (called *Shavuot*, meaning "weeks" in Hebrew) falls on the fiftieth day after the original Passover. On that day, God gave the Torah to Moses on Mount Sinai. The Christian festival of Pentecost falls on the 50th day after the resurrection of Jesus.

Being a Project Transformation site church is never an easy task. There are months of work that go into reaching children, creating space, and all the logistics.

This year's site churches have done all of that and are ready to serve their neighbors in a different way, but with the same mission.

This year, each of our site churches has agreed to give away their entire library to make sure children have books in their home because they understand the impact holding your own book can have.

Shoutout to San Antonio churches: Northern Hills, Laurel Heights, Westlawn (Brand New this year), Rio Grande Valley church: El Divino Redentor, and the two newest members of the family: Leander UMC and FUMC Georgetown.

But site churches alone are not enough. Thank you University UMC San Antonio and Alamo Heights UMC for stepping up to cover an entire site church's children. And to so many of you like Windcrest UMC & **Cedar Park UMC** who have committed to dozens of children having what they need this summer.

Whether you individually or your congregation has provided for one or one hundred, your partnership to serve your neighbors is what makes Project Transformation the hands and feet of Christ.

YOU are needed to make this possible.... HERE are the ways you might help:

- 1. **PEN PALS FOR EVERY CHILD**. Once a week you write a note and mail it along with a self addressed, stamped envelope for them to write back to you.
- 2. **READING BUDDIES** are volunteers that a child reads with each day for 30 minutes. Reading buddies usually read with 3 different children in a morning. Reading buddy time is from 10am to 12noon. You will be trained at 9:30 your first morning to volunteer. Every adult Reading Buddy must have a cleared background check.

WHAT DID YOU DO THIS SUMMER?

It used to be a popular topic when schools opened and students stood up in front of the class to answer the question: "what did you do in the summer?" Kids spoke about their activities before school started. We are sort of in the same situation. What did you accomplish during the coronavirus shut down? Hold onto your hats, because we are proposing that if we are going to dream --while we are sequestered and cannot meet in-person, what else could we be doing while we wait?" -- dream big: How about renovating our Sanctuary restrooms?

The work could be done in about a week while the building is empty. What better time to upgrade our restrooms than when people are not in the building?

But we can't begin to think about this unless we come up with a positive response and people actually are willing to pledge contributions to specifically renovate the restrooms, with accompanying new carpet and paint. We already have one congregant who is willing to contribute 20% of the total cost. Can you meet the challenge to reach our dream goal? The pledge duration is short: between now and the end of December, 2020.

Last Fall we postponed indefinitely upgrading our restrooms to be Americans with Disabilities (ADA) compliant, along with a companion expense of new carpet and paint improvements. The price tag last summer was estimated to be about \$53,000.

If this appeal strikes your fancy and you want to be part of a huge sense of accomplishment versus remaining largely passive in waiting for the COVID-19 virus restrictions to end, please contact Ron King (rbking411@att.net) to let him know what you might be willing to pledge for this Dream effort.

We envision the work starting as soon as the permit arrives and the work being completed before the building is opened again. The faster we raise the money, the sooner we might get the project started and finished (!) before we return to regular Sunday services.

The Refuge Ranch is in dire need of summer clothes. Most girls arrive at The Ranch with only the clothes on their backs. One of their first welcome activities is to select their wardrobe from the clothing items so generously donated by our church and community partners. We are currently experiencing a shortage of warm weather gear, in particular shorts(athletic and casual), tanks (with 2 inch straps), camisoles and athletic tops. The size/quantities we currently need are:

S-XXL or 3-25

At least 10 of each size/item is our current ask, as the girls need multiple pairs of each, though we appreciate whatever people can donate. We have a large percentage of girls who require clothes in the M to XXL sizes, so we could use larger quantities (closer to 20 per item/size) in those categories.

Please know that we only take new clothes with tags still attached as we believe in providing the best for the most vulnerable of our community.

Sunday school holds Kindness Parade for residents

LIBERTYVILLE, III. —

- A Sunday school class from the United Methodist Church of Libertyville held a Kindness Parade last week, covering a route that went all the way to Vernon Hills to help spread cheer and uplift residents.
- In a congregation of cars with decorated signs on-hand, the students rode with their parents through the area to see senior citizens, said Debbie Williams, the director of children and family ministries within the church. Residents met the parade with smiles and support for the efforts.
- With signs ranging from "We love you," to decorated messaging with hearts, the aim of the parade, as stated in the namesake, was to spread kindness. But this concept of kindness came out from a larger lesson Williams has been teaching in her Sunday class.
- Williams said in her classes, which have consisted of Zoom meetings during Sunday school, she has been teaching her students about kindness. The idea for a parade stemmed from various lessons about this topic, and how in the current pandemic climate someone can show kindness.
- "How do you show kindness? Well, you hug somebody," she said. "But obviously you can't hug somebody or go to their house and visit them. You can't do those things (right now)."
- In coming up with ideas, the students expressed an interest in parades they had been a part of or seen in the past. It was with this Williams suggested the students visit senior citizens who live in a five-mile radius of the church. This led to signs being made and cars being decorated. Meanwhile, Williams got on the phone to tell the local seniors about the plan.
- Williams said while the kids had to stay in their respective cars, they were able to see each other and wave at the residents, which Williams said made things feel a little more normal than things are currently.
- "It really put our kindness into action," she said. "One thing I'm trying to instruct the kids on is, you have to put those thoughts into action all the time. Our theme is, 'It's cool to be kind all the time."
- But this parade is one thing in a long list of ideas and actions taken by the students to promote the concept of kindness. Other things pursued include different assignments and creative projects, such as bookmarks, which have been sent out to senior citizens.
- Looking to the future, Williams said these kindness lessons will be ongoing. She said in learning how to be kind, they've come up with an acronym, "**THINK before you speak**."
- The word **THINK** stands for be **T**ruthful, be **H**elpful, be **I**nspiring, be **N**ecessary and be **K**ind.
- "I teach the kids, kindness creates more kindness," Williams said. "It's like a chain reaction when you're kind to someone. Not only does it make them feel good, but it makes you feel good too."
