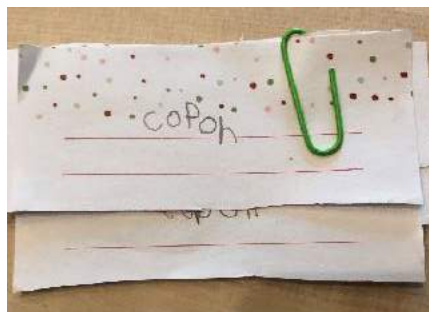

Josie created this string art card for Amanda, along with this heart felt card.



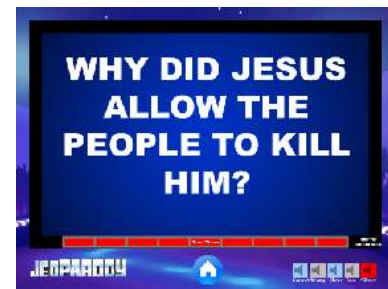
Leland prepared a COPON book for Amanda. She is very fortunate; it is fill in the blank.

## New Live Streaming System in Use

Since March 22<sup>nd</sup> we have been live streaming worship services using an iPhone, a tripod and the church Wi-Fi network. Following a successful dry run on May 15<sup>th</sup>, we have now transitioned to more robust equipment which we will continue to use even after the coronavirus pandemic has subsided.

The Sanctuary building interior currently looks like a giant sound stage with all the chairs stacked up around the edge.

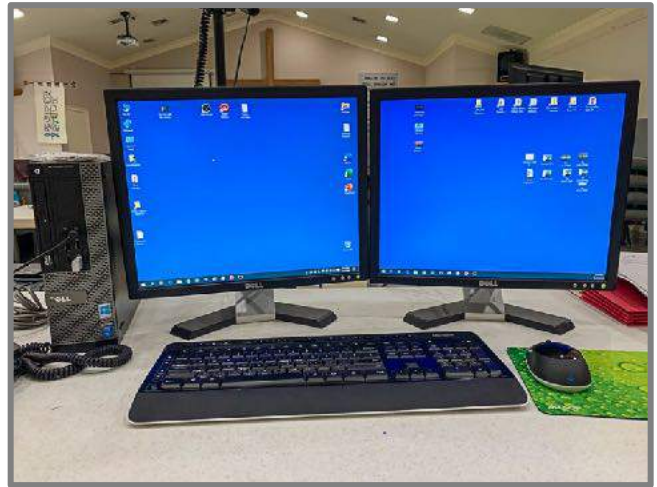
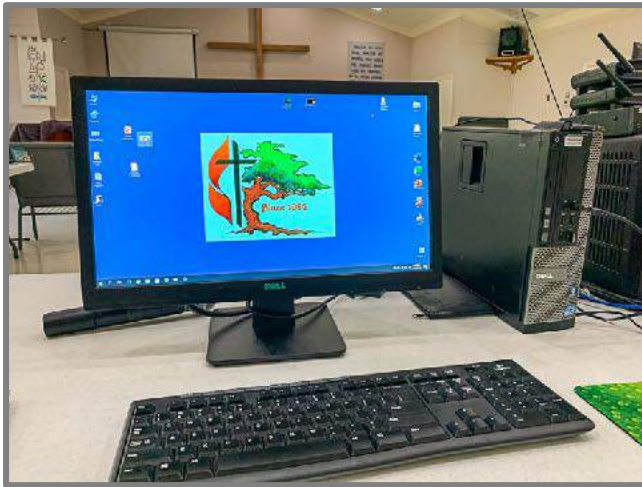


Key components of the new live streaming system include two video cameras, one in the center-back of the room and the other wall-mounted near the piano. Another key component is a video switching device which allows us to switch between cameras and the PowerPoint slides coming from a computer. The switching device also allows us to connect an audio feed from the four wireless microphones we have. Our pastors are getting used to wearing wireless lavalier microphones at all times!



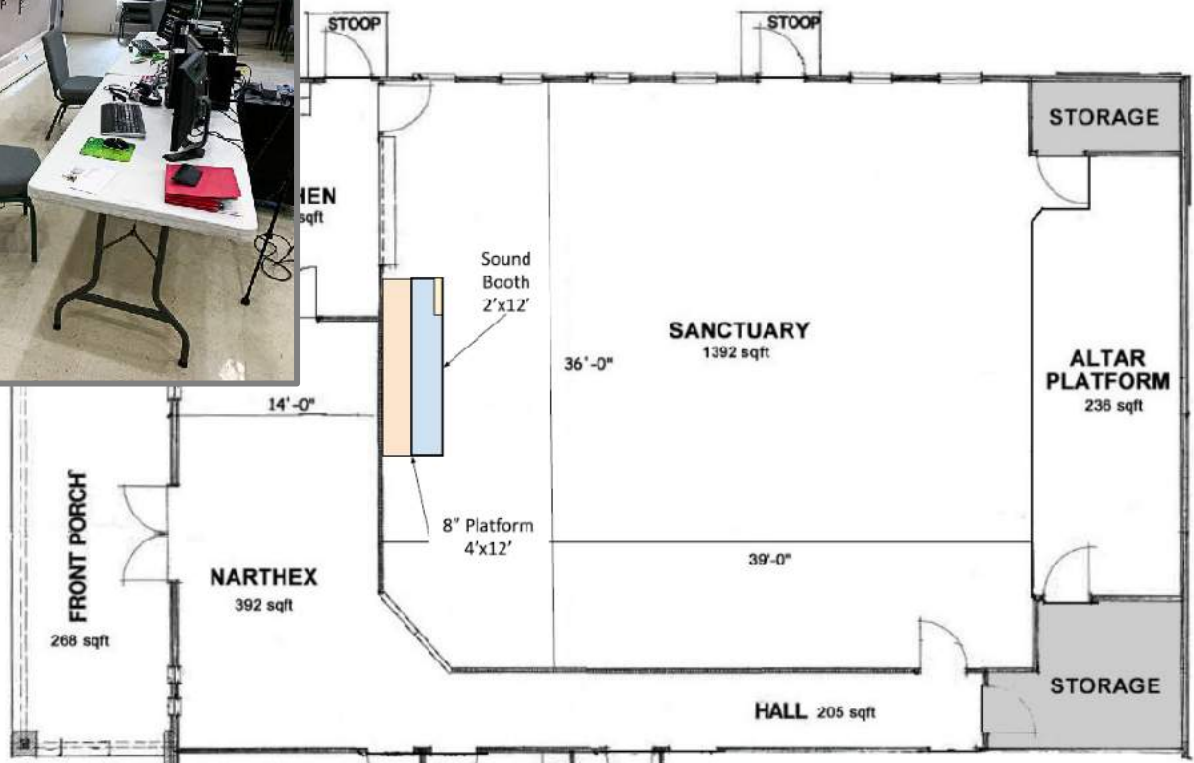

Two computers round out the list of key components for the new live streaming system. One computer runs the announcement slide loop and the worship slides. The other computer runs software for the video switch and the video capture and live streaming software. Both of these computers are connected to the church LAN and the Internet by hard-wired connections.

Connecting all of this equipment required a significant wiring project which included our existing projector, network, power and speakers. All of the wiring is concealed in the walls and attic of the building, entering the Sanctuary at the rear through the east wall.

When the time comes that we have in-person Sunday services again, all of the equipment and wiring will be housed in a sound booth to be constructed at the rear of the sanctuary extending 4 feet out from the wall, 12 feet along the wall and 54" tall.

The "Sign-Up" table that was formerly in this area has been relocated to the Narthex. The audio/visual bookcase which was formerly near the altar is now gone, its equipment transferred to the sound booth.

### **Finances & Leadership**

All of the money to pay for this system, including equipment, construction materials and sanctuary wiring was paid for by a \$3,600 grant from our Endowment Fund and approximately \$2,000 in equipment donations by members. The main Sony camera, other cameras and several cables were donated by Hardy Porterfield.

A live streaming team did all the research, designed and created the system and performed initial setup and tests. This team consisted of Neil Howard, Sergio Longoria, Hardy Porterfield, Dean Feazell and Todd Greer. Dan McNichol and Russ Lundstrom are helping with the sound booth construction which has just begun.

### **Call for Volunteers**

Anyone wishing to help run this system can volunteer to be a sound technician. We have a training manual and training videos on what to do as well as in-person training, when conditions permit. Contact Neil Howard if you are willing to help out from time to time as a volunteer sound technician. This is a great opportunity for young people who like to use cameras, push buttons and play video games!

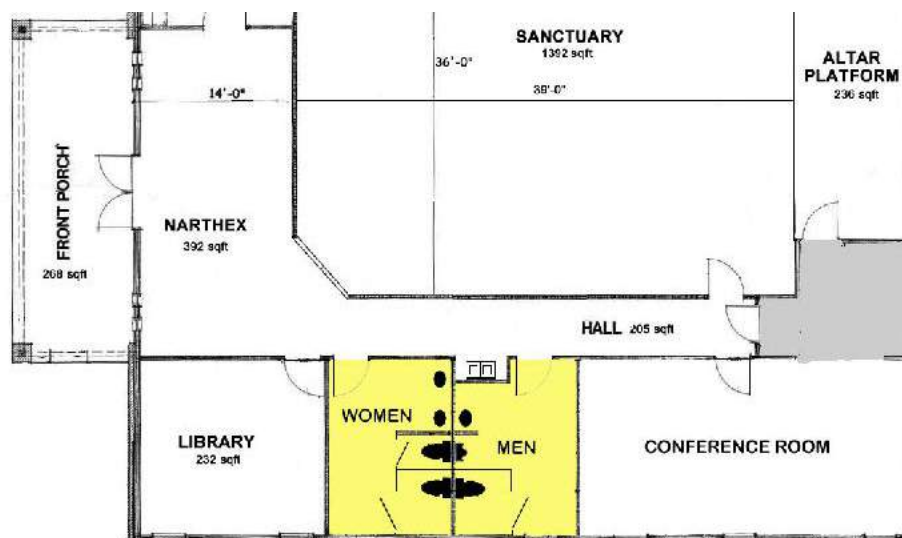
We talked with the City of Cedar Park Permit Department, “how long would it take to get a permit to upgrade our restrooms?” Answer: It can take ten days to apply, get a review and receive comments back to the applicant. If the construction permit is submitted on a Monday, it would be considered at the Tuesday meeting. The City would respond with comments, not by the near Friday, but by the following Friday (within 10 days). Bonus: we can do two things at once. We can start the permitting process before we go out to get bids from contractors, and update the permit with their name when the known contractor is hired.

Is this enormous undertaking even realistic at this time? To pay for the remodeling, this would be money over and above our current pledges – even though we are not meeting in person, expenses continue to come due. It would be like the effort to build a dream parking lot, or a dream outdoor sanctuary, or a dream Park Street Frontage Landscaping Project.

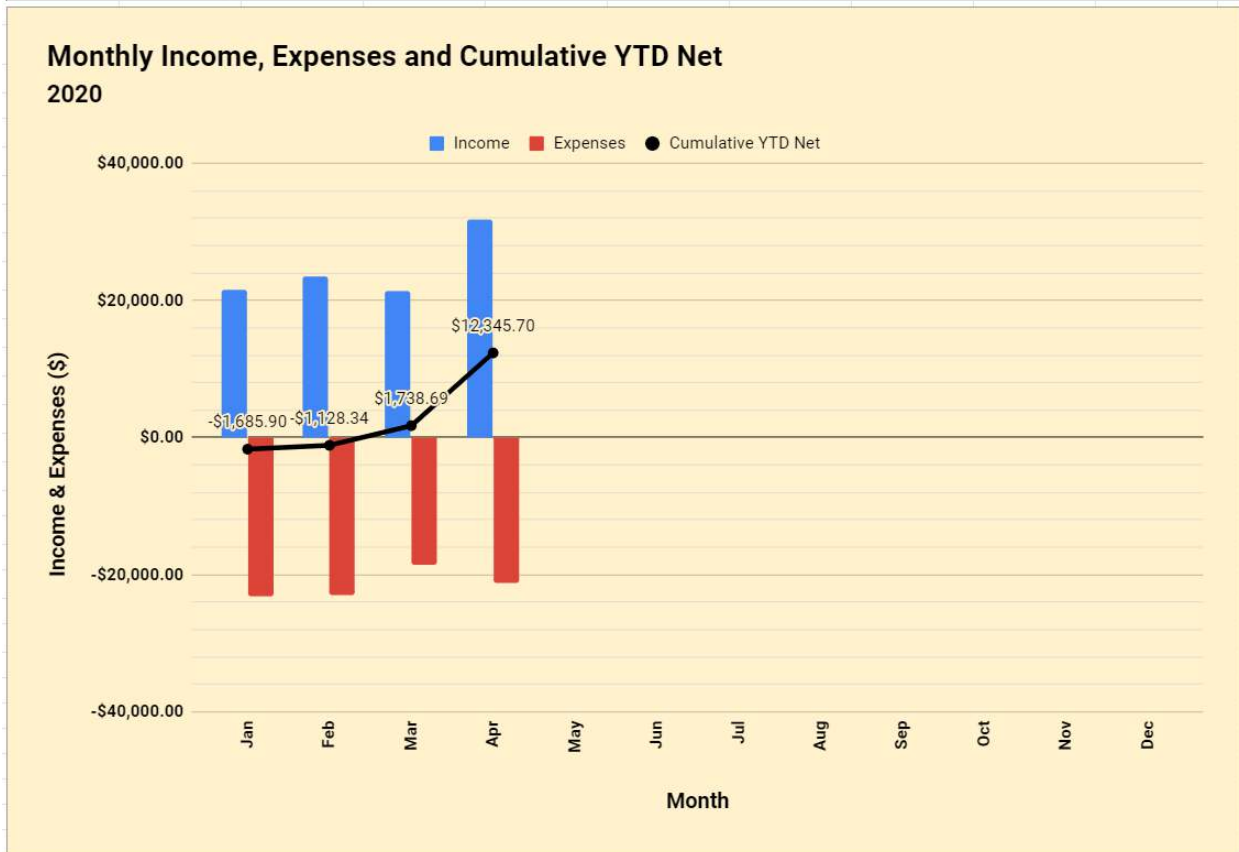
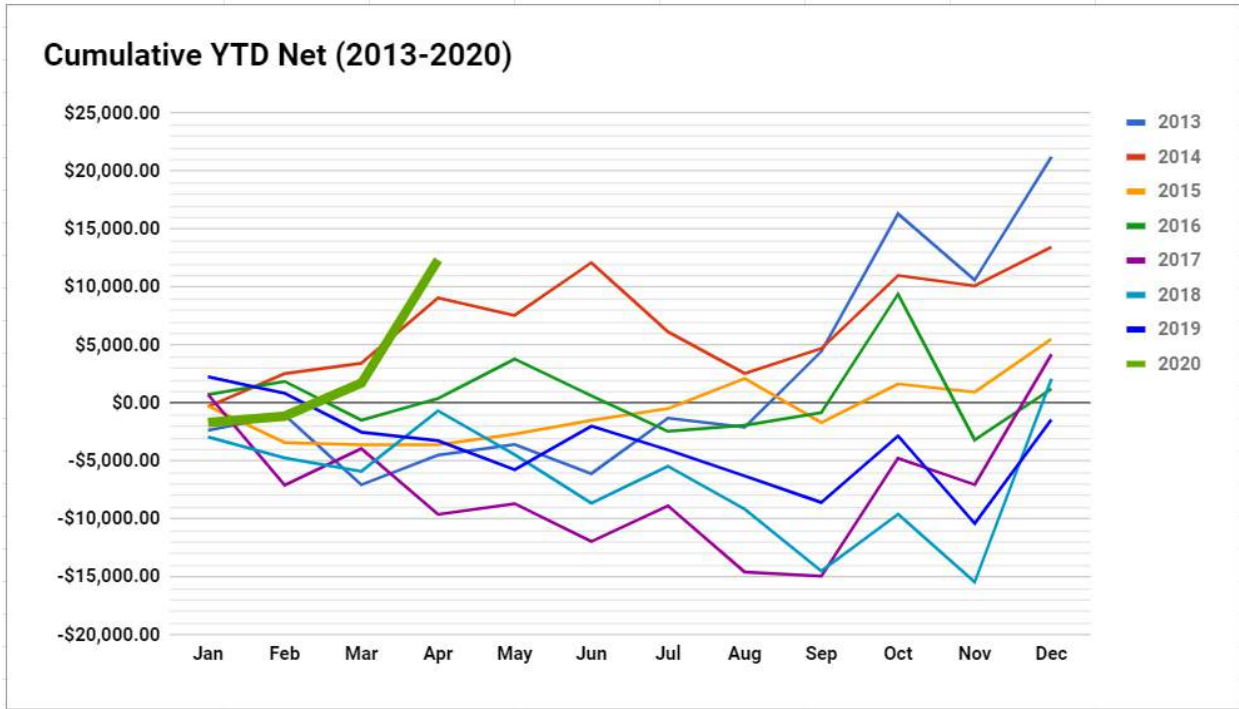
The work could be done in about a week while the building is empty. What better time to upgrade our restrooms than when people are not in the building?

But we can't begin to think about this unless we come up with a positive response and people actually are willing to pledge contributions to specifically renovate the restrooms, with accompanying new carpet and paint. We already have one congregant who is willing to contribute 20% of the total cost. Can you meet the challenge to reach our dream goal? The pledge duration is short: between now and the end of December, 2020.

If this appeal strikes your fancy and you want to be part of a huge sense of accomplishment versus remaining largely passive in waiting for the COVID-19 virus restrictions to end, please contact Ron King ([rbking411@att.net](mailto:rbking411@att.net)) to let him know what you might be willing to pledge for this Dream effort. We envision the work starting as soon as the permit arrives and the work being completed before the building is opened again. The faster we raise the money, the sooner we might get the project started and finished (!) before we return to regular Sunday services.
