Live Streaming Will Continue Indefinitely

We have been live streaming worship services at Cedar Park First UMC since March 22, 2020. In case you were wondering, there is **no** plan to **ever** discontinue live streaming our Sunday morning worship service, even after the COVID-19 pandemic is ancient history.



The Trustees and Church Council previously authorized development of a robust live streaming system and construction of a sound booth at the rear of the sanctuary. The equipment for the more robust live streaming system has been in regular use since May 17, 2020. There is

CPFUMC Family Members,

"When will the church re-open?" Another month has gone by without an answer. We are confused about that answer more than ever.

The council is reviewing and studying data as well as gathering information as to what re-opening might entail. The answer to this has many variables. We all are ready to re-open the church, but we must do it slowly and as safely as possible.

Pastor Peter has given us guidelines to re-opening the church. In using the re-opening plan from the White House entitled "Opening Up America Again", it states that a phased approach to re-opening should not occur until there is a "downward trajectory of documented cases within a fourteen-day period." This is in agreement with the document entitled "When and How to Reopen

We have 6 YOUTH and 3 adults planning to do UMARMY for the LOCAL mission trip NEXT week. We will be serving at HCCM, and Montopolis Friendship Center. We are building shade structures for both the playground and the gathering area, painting a mural, building community garden beds, mowing and sorting items for the two thrift stores.

We are in need of sponsors for each YOUTH and adult worker at \$99 each (3 of the 9 are already paid for by generous church members). We are also in need of funds for materials to build the garden beds, and shade coverings (already have about \$1000 in kind donations for one of the shade areas; next week we will be compiling the cost of concrete, wood, nails etc). Currently, we are the ONLY mission team in Texas (!); we are still recruiting our sister churches but for NOW - YOUR YOUTH are the ones stepping forward. Well done church!!

We will celebrate our mission efforts with a Senior Send-off will be the Thursday of UMARMY at Sea World San Antonio (pandemic permitting).

Holy Land Trip has the YOUTH working painting decks, building fences, mowing yards, painting fences and various garden tasks. We raised about another \$2500 in the past two months through hard work and lots of sweat and most of all from generous supporters! Thanks to the Sidneys, the Howards, Edna, Sterling, Cilla, Clara and others. We are awaiting the new school year calendar to see what adjustments will need to happen for Spring Break 2021.

We began a new series with our YOUTH worship time: A YOUTH Study Managing Anxiety from the UMW. Extremely well received by the YOUTH. We will explore what anxiety is and isn't; when it is positive and when it is negative; how the teen brain functions and











chemical reactions to emotions; developing coping mechanisms and strategies which integrate physical and spiritual exercises.

Last but not least: We had a NEW YOUTH (Noah, 7th grade) from a new family (the Manfredini's-recently moved into the area) join us and he had a good time. He plans on joining us again. Last Sunday the basic shell and floor support modules were built and installed.









On Thursday evening, the center support, desktop and shelf were installed. Then the wiring was routed up through a removable floor panel.










All that was left was final trim-out on Friday and equipment re-installation on Saturday. We were ready for live streaming again on Sunday morning!

after Covid-19," produced by the former CDC director Tom Frieden's organization PreventEpidemics.org (this document also states that if there is a 14-day decrease in cases, along with a decline in deaths over those 14 days, there should be a further 4-week waiting period before re-opening to ensure there is no significant increase after the initial 14 days). So, his criteria for re-opening would involve determining the trajectory of documented COVID-19 cases in Williamson County (the 7-day moving average), along with monitoring deaths. Peter agrees with Rev. Alex Shanks, who wrote in an article entitled "Why Reopening a Church Is Different" (referred to by Bishop Schnase in his recent Rio Texas Conference video message), "We need a new culture marked by a willingness to put the safety of others ahead of our personal preferences... This is not a time to focus primarily on what we may be sacrificing by not gathering, but how we are serving and loving all our neighbors by gathering too soon."



You can help Pastor Peter and the council follow the data from Williamson County. The information includes data for Williamson, Travis, and Bell counties.

no plan to **ever** discontinue live streaming our Sunday morning worship service, even after the COVID-19 pandemic is over. A 9:20 video tour of this system is available at https://youtu.be/vgghWeAz-gI.

There is now a regular rotation of 7 live streaming technicians (Neil Howard, Sergio Longoria, Todd Greer, Dean and Lisa Feazell, David Longoria and Dan McNichol) to sustain the live streaming effort every Sunday morning. If you would like to join this team, contact Neil Howard or Sergio Longoria.

Our pastors have adapted well to the new worship style and the opportunities that it offers as well as the challenges it presents.

Recently we have made improvements to the live streaming system in the form of a remotecontrolled camera mounted on the south wall of the sanctuary. Hardy Porterfield donated this



camera pan and tilt mechanism. This allows us greater flexibility to bring new perspectives and camera angles to the livestream every Sunday. In addition, we have constructed a real, permanent sound booth in the rear of the sanctuary against the back (east) wall. This booth was designed and built by CPFUMC members.

The live streaming system was funded by a \$3600 grant from our Endowment Fund and approximately \$2500 in donations from members. If you would like to contribute to this effort, we have a Live Streaming Designated Fund. The major expenses were for rewiring the sanctuary for this system, purchase of some new equipment not already donated by members or already owned by the church, and materials for constructing the sound booth. With this substantial investment in time and money, you can understand why we will be continuing to use the live streaming system even after we again begin meeting for Sunday worship onsite.




