HELP NEEDED !!! HILL COUNTRY COMMUNITY MINISTRIES (HCCM) THANK YOU !!

Last week we had our Member Churches meeting & I wanted to share with you some of the info that was discussed.

For the first 6 months of 2020 they have served 15,077 families, of which 2,310 were new . Compare this to the 13,519 families served for ALL OF 2019. If that continues it will be an increase of 45% . Massive increase. They have distributed 545,519 pounds of food this year which is 100,000 pounds more than the first 6 months of last year.

LIVE STREAMING VS PRE-RECORDED WORSHIP SERVICES

Since March 22, 2020 we have been providing a live streamed worship service on the church Facebook page. <u>Live streamed service</u>

Typically begins on Sunday morning at around 9:45 am with an announcement loop just like we used to see during the pre-service gathering time when we were meeting in-person. At around 10:00-10:05 am the worship service begins and you can watch it live in progress. We make recordings of these live streamed services available on our Facebook page, the church website (cpfumc.org) and in HD on the church YouTube channel.

Pre-Recorded Services

- From time to time it has been convenient for our pastors and musicians to pre-record a worship service and play it on Sunday instead of doing a live streamed service. To make it as much like the live streaming worship service, we record a 15-minute segment of looping announcements and pre-service piano music just like the regular live stream worship service. The worship service begins approximately 15 minutes into the pre-recorded service after the looping announcements are over.
- The **pre-recorded services** are set to be available beginning at 9:45 am on Sunday morning, just like our typical live streamed worship services. Once the pre-recorded service becomes available on Facebook, you have to start the recorded video by clicking on the arrow in the middle of the video screen. The Full HD (1080p60) video on our YouTube channel will start automatically once it is available at 9:45 am and you go to the YouTube link.
- Think of the **initial 15 minutes** as the **Pre-Service Gathering Time**. You can make comments on our Facebook page to indicate your attendance. If you have seen the announcements enough, you can always Fast Forward to the beginning of the service. After all, it is all pre-recorded!
