Edward Duke Squibb was a proud father, brother, and friend, always ready to share a pun or joke with anyone who would listen. Duke passed away at his residence on January 21 at the age of 86.

Duke was born to John Donald and Julia Duke Squibb on January 13, 1935. He graduated from the University of Texas at Austin School of Architecture in 1956, and from 1959 to 1961 he studied as a Taliesin Fellow at the Frank Lloyd Wright Foundation. Duke trained in the Army Corp of Engineers and served as a reservist until 1967. He worked in Austin and Dallas for private architectural firms for 19 years and for 32 years for the state of Texas in the departments of Parks and Wildlife and Health, retiring in 2006. Serving and teaching others was his delight.

Duke was predeceased by his brother, John Donald Squibb, Jr. He is survived by his three children, Chris Squibb, Emily Duff, and Lori Deemer and two grandchildren, Kaylee and Nathaniel.
