The trustees continue to work with the insurance adjuster and the restoration companies. As of today, most of the cleanup and demolition are complete. Minor restoration has begun. Due to the uncertainty of a completion date, we are unsure when the contractor will finish the restoration.

The Church will follow CDC guidelines for reopening. The Council will monitor the progress monthly and update you.

#### An Uplifting Story from our Water Disaster

On Tuesday, March 16, a small team of workers assembled to come up with the property damage report which would be filed with the insurance claim. Sue Sidney, Laurel Fabian, David Gibbs, Jimmy West, Anita Martin, and Neil and Jane Howard moved every chair and looked at every wet book.



Over all we lost 74 books due to water damage. They were swollen, wet and full of mold. Even recycling places would not take them, so into the trash they went. The chairs on the other hand are another story. We had 45 damaged and discolored chairs stacked directly under the water fountain of burst water pipe misery.

Each chair was examined and we sprayed enzyme to attack the mold which forms on every wet and drying surface. The worst damaged (45) were set aside and claimed as property damage on our insurance claim. But what do you do with 45 serviceable but disfigured chairs?

One solution is the great Park Street Market – open to all who pass by and have interest in what you have set out on the curb. We set out just four chairs to see if there would be any shoppers

interested in the damaged chairs.

This timing coincided with the work of moving great piles of mulch, so we had workers on site. So, when we were shoveling mulch into wheel barrels to spread in the flower beds and noticed a pickup truck stopped and loading the chairs into the bed of the truck, out we went to ask if they would like more chairs. A resounding yes was the answer. This was a team of parishioners from a new church starting in North Austin near Lamar Blvd.

They wanted all the chairs, despite the condition. "When you don't have any chairs to sit on, any chair will do." A couple of days later we got pictures of the chairs in their new home and a lovely thank you note from the truck driver, Josue Flores. They have 41 parishioners who are meeting on-line by Zoom with live music. Their gathering space is temporary but is now ready for inperson service when COVID restrictions are lifted and our chairs have found a wonderful new home.

#### **Council Approves Multicasting Initiative**

During the March 2021 Church Council meeting, Neil Howard made a 20-minute presentation entitled *Where Could We Go with Live Streaming? – More than just Facebook*. The gist of the presentation was that we have been live streaming our Sunday morning worship service for over a year now to the church Facebook page only. There are more options than a Facebook-only live streaming strategy. Having more than one live streaming destination would allow us to expand our witness and outreach in the community and avoid potential future censorship actions from a single live streaming destination beyond our control. Neil presented various options and costs for multicasting including to destinations such as Facebook, YouTube and our own church website.

Following the presentation, the Council discussed the options and approved a tentative budget of between \$50-\$100 per month to expand our live streaming destinations beyond Facebook-only. The Live Streaming Team met on the Saturday, March 27th, to begin testing two multicasting options. Using a service named Restream.io, the Team was able to live stream to a private Facebook page and to the church YouTube channel simultaneously. Based on this encouraging start, the Live Streaming Team decided to purchase a multicasting account with Restream.io, a local Austin-based company. The diagram below shows the vision of how our multicasting might look.



Instead of going to the single Facebook destination directly from the church, we can multicast to Restream.io and they will forward our live stream to additional destinations. Restream.io also has a consolidated chat feature which allow us to monitor comments/prayer requests from all our destinations combined in one place.

Stay tuned. CPFUMC live streaming worship services may soon be available on more than just Facebook!
