Sunday School and other groups are encouraged to begin meeting. Please contact your instructor for time and location.



Hello PT Volunteers, We are super excited to be back in person this summer! Reading Buddy & Dinner Volunteers are needed! Read at any of our 5 Site Churches:

Austin: Leander UMC & FUMC Georgetown

Rio Grande Valley: El Divino Redentor UMC, McAllen

San Antonio: Northern Hills Ministry Center & Westlawn UMC

In Person Reading Buddies:

Caring volunteers are needed to read with children in grades 1st-6th, one-on-one, each day for 30 minutes per child (you will read with more than one child most days). Volunteers can sign-up for one day or multiple days throughout the summer, and no prior experience is needed! All Reading Buddy volunteers are required to be fully vaccinated, need to pass a criminal background check, and will need to complete an <u>online training</u> prior to their first shift.

Intern Dinner Volunteers:

Volunteers are needed to provide dinners to our dedicated interns in our 3 geographies throughout the summer, as well as for all PT interns during training week in June. This is a great opportunity to serve, encourage, and get to know the young people who are making a difference! Meals will be delivered/served at PT's housing facilities in each geography.

Reading Tester Volunteers:

Current or retired educators are needed to complete simple running records and surveys with children 1st-6th grades in PT's summer camp program. Volunteers will be assisting to collect pre and post-reading data. Background check required for all volunteers 18+, online reading tester training required before first volunteer session.

HILL COUNTRY COMMUNITY MINISTRIES (HCCM)

Laces for Leander (athletic shoe / sock drive)

It is time for the HCCM annual athletic shoe / sock drive. The distribution of shoes will be July 31st. However, the drive to seek athletic shoes / socks donations is beginning now.

To refresh your memory, since there was not an athletic shoe / sock drive last year due to Covid, let me explain what this is all about.

Each year HCCM conducts this drive to aid students who attend the Leander ISD schools and are registered at their school to receive free or reduced lunches. These students will come to HCCM on July 31st and get to pick out a pair of athletic shoes / socks both girls and boys at no cost to them or their parents.

The schools encompass all grades Kindergarten through 12th grade. For ease of figuring this means approximately 5 years old to approximately 18 years old.

HCCM (not the recipients) is emphasizing that the athletic shoes be name brand. It is their belief that this benefits the students physically as well as emotionally. Physically, as these should will provide for an extended length of wear. Emotionally, these shoes will put them on an emotional level with the other students who own such shoes as a matter of course.

What are name brand shoes? Some examples are; Nike, Reebok, Converse, Adidas, Vans, and Under Armor.

How can you participate? You can purchase a pair / pairs of athletic shoes or socks and leave them in the cardboard box at the front of the Sanctuary building and I will get them to HCCM. Another option is that you can drop them off at my house (603 Victoria Cove Cedar Park. A third option is to let me know via text or e mail (512-771-1680, bob927bowker@gmail.com) and I will arrange to pick them up.

How large is this effort? In 2019 HCCM gave away over 700 pairs of athletic shoes / socks. The objective this year is for 1,000 pairs of athletic shoes / socks.

It is desirable to obtain the shoe donations as early as we can so HCCM will know how many shoes they need to purchase to make sure they have enough for everyone.

Thank you, in advance, for all of you who participate.
