A Conversation with Jim and Ruth West:

Q: When was your first day at CPFUMC and what do you remember about it?

A: I was driving on West Park Street coming home from golfing one day in 2010 when I saw several pumpkins in a yard near the street. I turned into the driveway, stopped the car and got out. I was approached by a tall man who asked if I wanted to buy pumpkins. I said "no", then I asked him who is the preacher here now? He answered, "I am and then introduced himself and Cilla Gregory". I told Peter I used to come to CPFUMC occasionally but now I attend services at FUMC in Leander. He suggested I go to services in Leander 2-3 times and then come here 2-3 times and see which church I preferred. Ruth and I did just that and decided CPFUMC was best for us and by January or February 2011 we joined the church.

- Teen moms at Head Start, the daycare program for ages birth through five for families meeting the federal low-income guidelines.


We would love to see you on August 2nd when we gather in fellowship as women of the church to support these important ministries in our community.

July 26: Reflection on 2 Corinthians


(Reflection days allow you to pause, pray, and revisit key themes from the passages.)

Website Upgrade In Progress



military, joining the US Army in 1948 at age 16 by lying about my age. Jim served 25 years, retiring in 1973. We moved to Austin in 1973 and then moved to Cedar Park in 1992.



- Q: What church did you come to CPFUMC from?
- A: FUMC in Austin, and then St. Mark's in Austin.
- Q: Tell us about your family.

A: In August 1950 I was transferred from the Military Police (MP) Battalion in Fort Knox to the Airborne MP Company, Camp Breckinridge, KY. One day while on assigned duty as a main gate guard, I waved an incoming car loaded with post employees into the base. I looked at the male driver and the front seat female passenger. I asked my fellow gate guard if he saw the pretty gal passenger. Long story short, it was Ruth Springfield, a civilian personnel office clerk. Weeks passed without seeing her again until one evening three buddies and I went to a dance hall located about 10 miles from camp. I immediately saw a young girl I knew named Loretta and next to her was Ruth. Everyone started to dance except Ruth. I asked if she wanted to dance and she said "No." I didn't want to leave her alone so I introduced myself. The music was loud and the room was full of cigarette smoke so I asked her outside for some fresh air. She did...and it was all over for us...from that moment on. Within a week we started dating and married later that year, November 3, 1951.

We have two daughters Sara A. West and Jayne E. West (Gonzalez). We also have a granddaughter Ashley Narup and grandson Dustin Tune, great granddaughter Kayla Narup and great grandson Blake Narup of Leander, TX.
