Church Website Update Completed

On July 14th the upgraded version of the CPFUMC Church website went live. The upgrade was not something that we planned for. It was required when the author of our theme (the "template" for the website) changed the page editing tool plugin used by the theme. We had been using the original page editing tool for nine years and were familiar with it, so the change to a new page editing tool was a major change and a new learning curve for those maintaining the website.

We actually outsourced to the theme author and paid for (member donated) the updating of the 82 pages of our original website. That way we knew that we would be getting all of the pages in the new format without spending hours and hours ourselves learning how to

Church Finance Report

In June, the Church had an operating loss of -\$4,928.80. Contributions were up from May, but still below the average of the first five months of the year. Pledged contributions were down -11% from the YTD average in 2025. There is seasonality during summer months. Other Income was also lower in June. Overall expenses were in line with the YTD average in June. The Church has a net loss of -\$7,644.51 YTD in 2025. The Church continues to have adequate reserves to meet its financial obligations.

Can You Hear Me Now?

Improving Worship Audio

Recently we purchased some head worn microphones for our pastors to use. The new microphones were paid for by our Technology Fund. We hope that the new microphones will improve pickup of our pastors' voices for both in-person and live streaming worship participants. Until now we have been using lavalier clip-on microphones. Lavalier microphones are typical for speakers and speaking events, however if the speaker turns their head quickly or moves around a lot, the lavalier microphone is not as effective as a head



worn microphone. The head worn microphone ideally places the microphone capsule 2-3 cm from the corner of the speaker's mouth using a wire frame that hangs over the speaker's ears and rests on the back of their neck. This makes the microphone capsule position relative to the speakers mouth much more stable than for a lavalier microphone.

Your Part

Of course, there's a part in this that you can play as well. If you are listening to the live stream, you have some control over the volume yourself. You can turn up the volume of course! You can also use headphones for a more direct sound in your ears.

For those attending the worship service in-person, our all-volunteer Live Streaming Team will crank up the volume in the sanctuary a little bit. Feel free to sit closer to the front if you have trouble hearing well. All participants need to realize that we all have different hearing abilities and one solution cannot apply to all. We can only do our best.

convert all the pages. However, after all the pages were converted, we still had a lot of cleanup activities to make it look more presentable and to eliminate a large amount of scrolling on each page. We tightened up the design significantly and, in that process, we learned how to use the new page editing tool. All of this preliminary work took many days during May, June and early July.

We took the opportunity to update many of the pages that needed updating anyway. Ginger Goodin, Pastor Suzette, Pastor Peter, Karen Bowker, Amanda Theriot and others contributed updates to their pages on the website.

Neil Howard, Todd Greer, and Lisa and Dean Feazell all provide weekly updates to the website in order to keep up with all of the live streaming videos and changes in schedule of events. Todd handles the Upcoming Events This Week as well as weekly and monthly updates listing our publications Happenings and Connections, which are edited and produced by Stephanie Talley and Jill Lundstrom, respectively. Dean, Lisa and Neil handle the weekly updates on the website and our Facebook page on a rotating monthly basis.
