OCTOBER 5 TH IS WORLD COMMUNION/UMCOR SUNDAY

On October 5th , the first Sunday in October, CPFUMC and other United Methodist congregations will join many Christian churches across the globe in celebrating World Communion Sunday. World Communion Sunday began as World-Wide Communion Sunday at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburg, Pennsylvania in 1933. The Rev. Hugh Thompson Kerr and his congregation sought to demonstrate the interconnectedness of Christian churches, regardless of denomination.

On October 5 th , followers of Jesus Christ in large churches and small, on farms and in cities, in ornate buildings and under tents, will gather to receive the bread and cup of Holy Communion. Some will receive cubes of bread. Some will tear from a common loaf. Some will receive a wafer. Some will drink from a common chalice. Some will dip a piece of bread into the cup. Some will have individual glasses. Some will use wine; some juice. Some will offer both. Pastors will lead a variety of liturgies, in many languages. Clergy will dress traditionally, formally, and casually. Despite the differences in our denominations and traditions, we will all be celebrating our unity in Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

World Communion Sunday continues to be a special giving Sunday. This year we will be collecting money for the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR). Through UMCOR's efforts around the world, we are making a difference in the lives of communities and individuals whose lives have been upended by storms, wars, displacement, and hunger. Church Finance Report

In August, the Church had an operating loss of -\$5,160.53. Contributions remained under budget in August. Pledged contributions were up slightly from July, but were -8% below the YTD average in 2025. There is seasonality during summer months as people are often travelling. Operating expenses declined in August and were consistent with the average month in 2025. There were no items that stood out. The Church has a net loss of -\$19,423.08 YTD in 2025. The loss is attributable to income. Pumpkin Patch revenue has not yet occurred, but contributions will be needed to fill the gap. The Church continues to have adequate reserves to meet its financial obligations.

Microsoft Sends 60-Day Warning to Windows 10 Users

Microsoft will end support for Windows 10 on October 14, 2025. After this date, Windows 10

will continue to function, but it will no longer

receive security updates, feature updates, or technical support from Microsoft. This means
devices running Windows 10 will become increasingly vulnerable to security threats and malware.

To stay protected, users are advised to upgrade to Windows 11, which can be done for free if
the PC meets the Windows 11 system requirements, or to enroll in the Windows 10 Consumer

Extended Security Updates (ESU) program, which provides critical security updates for one additional year at a cost.

A recent announcement indicates that users who log into their Windows 10 device with a
Microsoft account and sync their settings may automatically receive one year of free extended
support, extending protection until October 2026.

VISA POLICY CHANGE AFFECTING STUDENT ACCESS AT LYDIA PATTERSON INSTITUTE

Due to the recent changes in U.S. visa policy, some of the students attending the United Methodist-affiliated high school Lydia Patterson Institute (LPI) in El Paso, Texas—especially those living in Ciudad Juárez—are being affected. New rules require all F-1 student visa applicants, both new and returning, to undergo enhanced screening. This includes public access to social media, documentation of online activity, and broad reviews of "hostile attitudes"—a term that remains undefined and open to wide interpretation.

These requirements are slowing the process and placing LPI's students from underserved communities at a disadvantage. Priority is being given to students at large universities, not schools like LPI, where 40% of the students are international and many face financial, political, and logistical barriers.

In response, LPI is preparing to offer hybrid learning this fall—with some students attending in person, and others learning remotely from across the border. Whether they are in El Paso or Juárez, the school's commitment is the same: the students will continue learning, and LPI will continue teaching, supporting, and offering scholarships.
