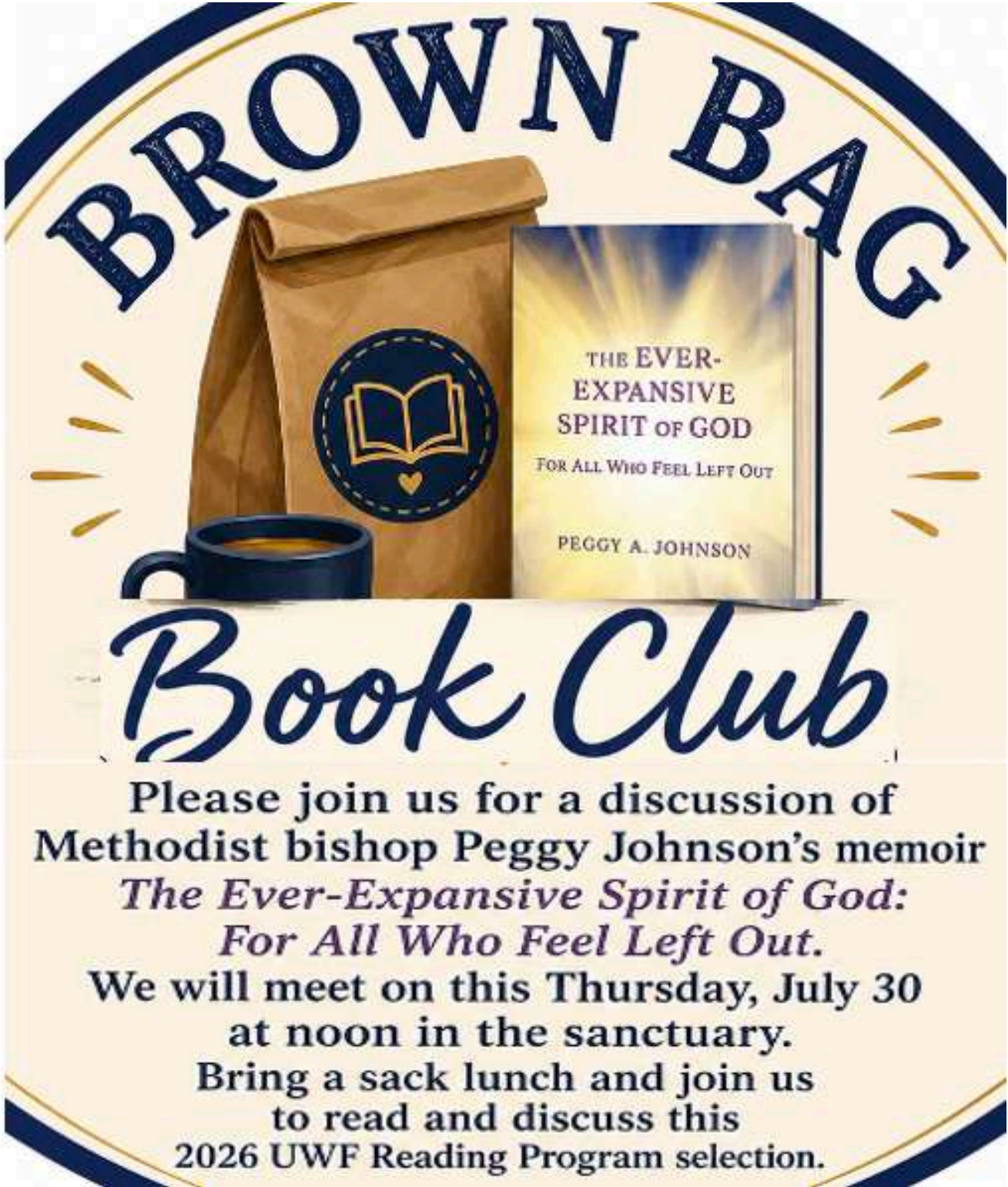

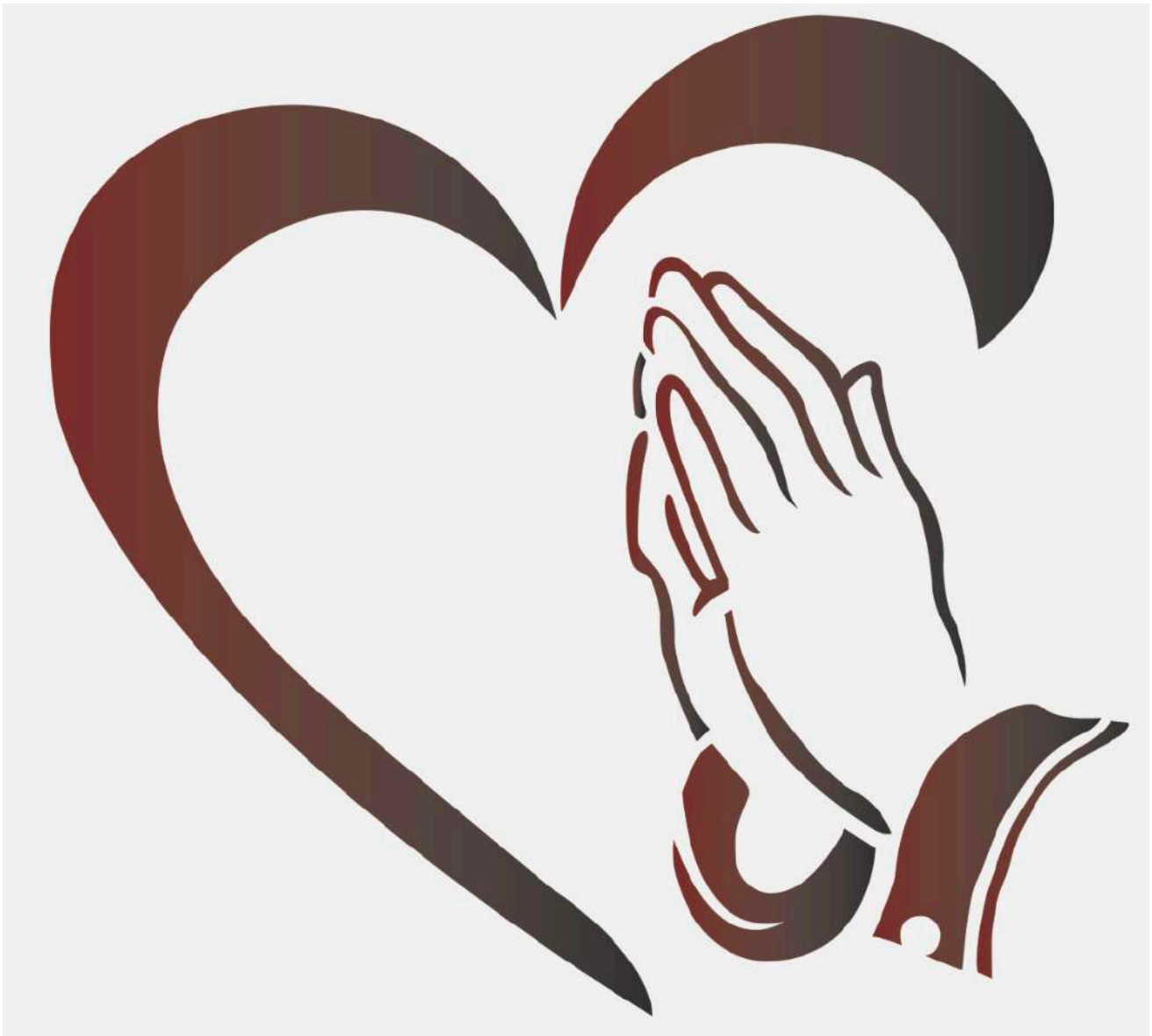

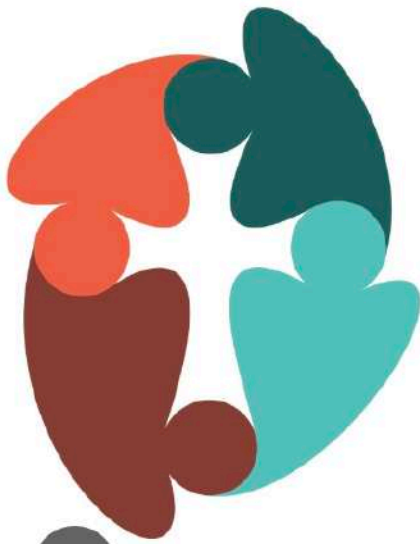

Finance Report

In April, the Church had an operating loss of -\$2,774. Income was aided by the \$2,000 annual contribution from A Child's Haven. However, pledged contributions declined -\$1,349 in April. The Church continues to do well on controlling operating expenses in 2026. Specific operating expense line items were consistent with budgeted amounts. The Church continues to have adequate reserves to meet its financial obligations.

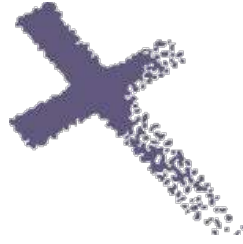
YTD Financial status through
